Dear Sir:

I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 2nd inst., enquiring as to the whereabouts of 3750 Pte. T. Power and the reason for the stoppage of his allotment since June last.

I beg to advise you that the reason why he did not come with the (Cassanara) draft is that he was arrested on April 30th at Twyford for felony, and tried at the Winchester Court of Assizes on May 30th. He was convicted and sentenced to four and two months consecutive imprisonment at Winchester. The date of expiration of sentence is 7.a.m. December 15th 1919, and the earliest possible date of discharge is November 15th 1919. The fact of this man being in prison accounts for the stoppage of his allotment, as a soldier forfeits all pay whilst in detention.

The foregoing is for your information, and you may use your discretion as to how much of it you will make known to his parents.

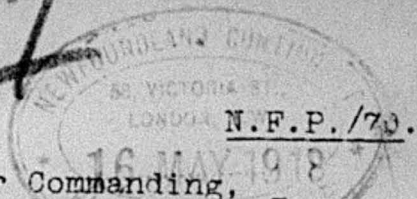

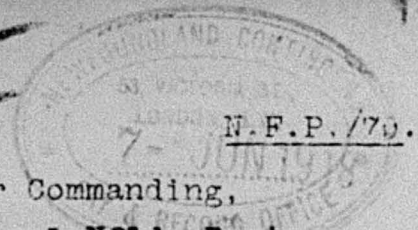

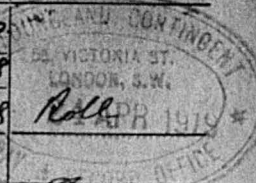
