With reference to your letter 26/1/17, records here show that the following parcels for No.2076, Pte.A. Adey, have passed through this office:

A large quantity of mail matter is passing through from day to day, is readdressed according to latest known whereabouts of addressees, made up in bags accordingly, which are taken over by the Army Postal authorities who thenceforward take charge for deliveries. It is much regretted to have your complaint, and as a matter of fact there have been a number of similar ones recently received, but in some cases enquiries have proved that it is rather more a question of delay which has presumably taken place at the Front, and it is of course hoped that this may prove to be so in your case.

During the month of December alone some 20,000 postal packets passed through this office for redirection and handing over to the Army Post Office, and it naturally only forms a very small proportion of the enormous quantities of postal matter that have to be dealt with in the Field.

I may add that the whole matter is and continues to form the subject of extensive enquiries, the results of which are reported to the Hon. the Colonial Secretary from time to time.

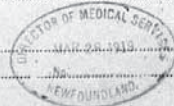

STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR.

#2076, Pte. Albert Adgy - Clarendville

Circumstances of Capture - When the Germans made their counterattack on December 3rd, they bombarded our trench with field guns and trench mortars and, having the exact range, they almost levelled our trenches. Nearly every man in my bit of the trench was either killed, or wounded or buried in. I was wounded badly in the left leg. I was lying in the trench when the Germans came up. They threw me up on the parapet and carried me off to their lines.

Details of Life & Treatment under Capture - I was taken to a Dressing-Station behind their lines, where my leg was dressed; then to Le Cateau for 6 days. I was quite well treated and had the best food here that I had all the time I was a prisoner. I was then shifted to Germany by hospital train and arrived at Munster, where I was put in hospital for about 5 months. I have many complaints to make about this hospital. There were about one hundred of us wounded men in one crowded hut, and we were practically given no attention all the time we were there. We were given one thin blanket to put over us and nothing but a thin singlet to wear, and we felt the cold very much, especially since we were not able to move about. Russian prisoners of war acted as our orderlies and the dressing of our wounds was left to them. They knew nothing about dressing us at all, and tried to dress us sometimes once a week, but never more than that. Paper bandages were used and they were a source of great discomfort, as the discharge from the wound went through the paper and it stuck to our wounds like glue. There were no latrine utensils in the hut and we had to crawl along the floor as best we could to relieve ourselves. Bed-patients who could not move had to relieve themselves the best way possible; consequently the floor was in an awful state every day. My leg was giving me so much pain that after being in the hospital for about two months with no signs of improvement, I asked the doctor to operate on my leg and take some of the pieces of shrapnel out. Then one morning I was sent for and taken to an operating room outside. I was laid on the table and the doctor simply ripped open my leg and probed for the shrapnel. I was not given any chloroform or anaesthetics of any kind, but just

had to grin and bear it. According as he yanked the pieces out, he put them into my hand. The food was very bad and very scarce, and I lost 90 ~~pounds~~ while I was in the Hospital.

About the middle of May I was discharged from the Hospital and sent to Saltan Camp. After two weeks I was sent out on light duty for a week, and then I was drafted out on working parties to Mulmshorne, Hanover. I was set to work cutting heather with a scythe and remained at that job for nearly six months. Our treatment on the whole was fair and I had nothing much to complain about except the food; but when the food parcels from the Red Cross began to arrive conditions were much better. The day before the Armistice was signed three others and myself managed to escape. We remained out for a day and a night when we were caught and imprisoned for 10 days, after which we were sent back to Saltan. Four days afterwards we were repatriated to England via Hamburg and arrived at Hull on December 28th.

Your letter of May 28th forwarding letter from Ex-Private Albert Adey, has been duly received. I beg to report as follows:-

No. 2076 ex-Private Albert Adey enlisted on 17th January, 1916. He have<sup>d</sup> his trade as Limberman. His age at that time was 19 years 10 months, so that in March this year he was 25 years. He proceeded overseas on 23rd March, 1916 and joined the Expeditionary Force on 9th July, 1916.- He was wounded in the right arm on 14th April, 1917, and after a term in hospital rejoined the Battalion on 7th June, 1917.- He was again slightly wounded on the 16th August, 1917 and rejoined the Battalion on 13th Sept., 1917.- On 3rd December, 1917, he was wounded in the hip and taken prisoner of war. He was released from Germany on 27th December, 1918; was repatriated on 30th Jan. 1919 and demobilised on 17th April, 1919, having served three years and ninety one days with the colors.

While he was a prisoner of war, he and two or three others made an attempt to escape, but they were all captured again. Escape from the enemy has been recognised by the Army Council as worthy of commendation, and military decorations have been awarded. Those who made signal attempts to escape have also been recognised by the War Office. His character while serving with the Regiment has been good.
