I have the honour to refer to the attached correspondence concerning the above noted.

George Baggs has been in Hospital since his return on the Corsican draft in June 1919. He has a condition of Nerve Paralysis which has been gradually clearing up, and while the progress has been slow, Major Knight who has been in charge of the case gives in his opinion that operative treatment is not indicated, and that as the inflammatory condition subsides he will get better use of his hand.

I am arranging that he will be placed before the Standing Medical Board at an early date, and if the Board is of the opinion that he should receive special treatment arrangements will be made either under the Soldier's Civil Re-Establishment Committee in Canada, or under the War Risk Insurance Bureau in the U.S.A. for his treatment.
