I am in receipt of your letter of June 17th, forwarding correspondence from No. 3507 Ex-Pte. George Baker. In reply I would state that this man enlisted on the 3rd March 1917; proceeded to France on 6th November, 1917; was wounded in the right leg on the 20th November, 1917. He was invalided to England on the 12th December; and had the right leg amputated on the 14th December. After several months in hospital, he was repatriated on the 12th March, 1919, and discharged on the 27th April, 1919.

He is drawing a pension of \$20.00 per month, which will continue during his life, subject of course to any alterations authorised in the present schedule. The amount that he is receiving is the maximum payable for his disability. This man has received all moneys due to him from this Department; and it is regretted that no further financial assistance can be given.

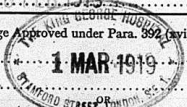


