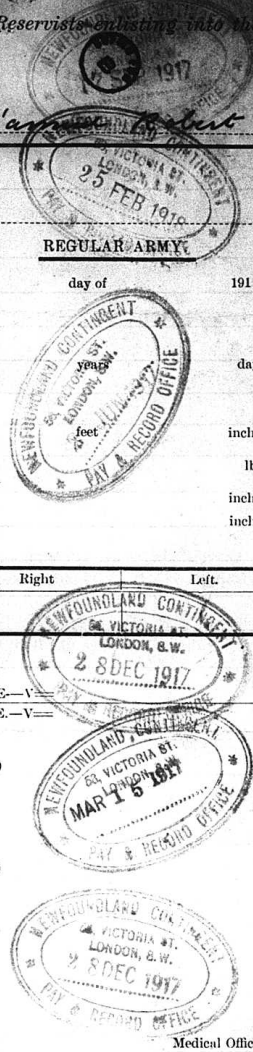

I really think that it is only right that they should be granted so, I have had 3 sons enlist in Active Service, Samuel whom I am now referring to, George whom you know have been missing since last December and Charles who is not yet eighteen years of age and is now training with the Signalling Corps at Dunstable, he has been gone a year and a half I should be pretty obliged if you could let me know, and if not asking too much if they should be granted! leave and at what time
