With reference to your letter 25/9/17, relative to the estate of the late 2/Lieut. Harold Barrett: I beg to inform you that his pay was regularly deposited to his credit at the Bank of Montreal, 9, Waterloo Place, Pall Mall, London, S. W. (1) at the end of each Pay period (four weeks) as provided in C. L. 8, copy enclosed.

It is the custom in the event of an Officer becoming non-effective within a Pay period to credit his account to the end of that period and retain the amount to the credit of his estate, which in the case of Lt. Barrett is £17, odd.

His non-effective account will, at the expiry of the usual period of 4 months from the date of death, be forwarded to the Minister of Militia for disposal.

It will be necessary for you to arrange with the Bank of Montreal with regard to any balance of your son's account in London to be transferred to the St. John's Branch.

It is not known here whether a Will exists, and if not naturally certain formalities will have to be observed by you, information regarding which may be obtained from the Hon. the Minister of Justice in St. John's, whose department it is understood is dealing with the estates of deceased Officers and other ranks.
