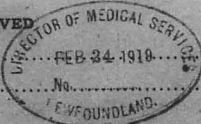

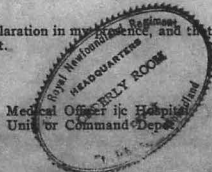

Coombs was also taken and Pte. Cahill was killed by a bullet just as he was making for the trench.

Details of Life and Treatment - Coombs and myself were taken to St. Quentin where searched and questioned very hard. After 4 days there we were sent to Frankfort for a day and then to Colegne. Finally we reached Gissan Camp in the middle of Germany, where we were kept for two months. We were sent to work at the stone quarry there. The work was very heavy and we were hard at it every day from 5 a.m. to 7 p.m. The food was very bad here; and we were continually under the eye of the sentries. On very wet days when we refused to work we were sent to prison cell for a week at a time, where the treatment was very bad.

Then we were sent to Rockenburg for 21 months to work in the Quarries there. The food was very bad and we looked forward each day to the parcels of food from England and Newfoundland. We found that they used to open our parcels before they reached us and take things out. We got along very well on the whole except for the food. Then we were sent to Maliners, a big brick industry place, for about 6 months. This was far worse than Gissan Camp or Rockenburg. The work was harder and the food was worse and scarcer. Whilst there, I got influenza and was very sick for week. The only treatment I got was ^{one} Aspirin Tablet.

I was at Maliners when the Armistice was signed and then we all quit work and then we were marched back 12 miles to Gissan Camp. After



STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR

245, Pte. Peter Barron - Address 38 Duckworth Street

Enlisted Jan. 1915 - Proceeded Overseas - April 1915

Company in France - "A" Company

Date & Place of Capture - Beaumont Hamel - June 28th/16

Circumstances of Capture - I was one of the raiding party before July 1st with Captain Butler. We went out and blew up the German wire in front of us and advanced towards their trench trying to get a prisoner for identification. Pte West and myself got tangled in the wire, in a sap in their trench and I got wounded in the back by a bomb. The Germans came up and took us prisoners. West died in the trench. Pte Coombs was also taken and Pte. Cahill was killed by a bullet just as he was making for the trench.

Details of Life and Treatment - Coombs and myself were taken to St. Quentin, where we were searched and questioned very hard. After 4 days there we were sent to Frankfort for a day and then to Cologne. Finally we reached Gissan Camp in the middle of Germany, where we were kept for two months. We were sent to work at the stone quarries there. The work was very heavy and we were hard at it every day from 5 a.m. to 7 p.m. The food was very bad here; and we were continually under the eye of the sentries. On very wet days when we refused to work we were sent to a prison cell for a week at a time, where the treatment was very bad.

Then we were sent to Rothenburg for 21 months to work in the quarries there. The food was very bad and we looked forward ~~every~~ ^{each} day to the parcels of food from England and Newfoundland. We found that they used to open our parcels before they reached us and take things out. We got along very well on the whole except for the food. Then we were sent to Malinens, a big brick industry place, for about 6 months. This was far worse than Gissan Camp or Rothenburg. The work was harder and the food was worse and scarcer. Whilst there, I got Influenza and was very sick for a week. The only treatment I got was one Aspirin Tablet.

I was at Malinens when the armistice was signed and then we all quit work and then we were marched back 12 miles to Gissan Camp. After two weeks we were sent by train to Metz

and then through Alsace-Lorraine to Boulogne and
arrived in England on December 5th, 1918.


