Based on Bureau Letter dated Feb. 24th, 1923, initialed WWC-AS, numbered 62-4680, enclosing copies of communications received from the Department of Militia, St. Johns, Newfoundland, with regard to THOMAS F. BARRON, believed to have been at Cumberland, Mills, Maine, Agent proceeded to Cumberland Mills, leaving Boston on February 27th.

At Cumberland Mills Agent interviewed the Postmaster, Mr. Newhall, who advised that there was no record of this principal as having received mail at that station. However, Mr. Newhall suggested that Agent make inquiries at the different factories in the town. At the factory of the Cumberland Mills Mfg. Co., Agent learned that JOSEPH M. BARRON had applied for work on February 15th, giving his street address as A Street, Portland, Me.

Agent proceeded to Portland, Me., and at the Victoria Hotel learned that subject had been stopping here, but had left for Boston three days previous, and that possible address was #124 Staniford Street.

Agent upon arriving in Boston, proceeded to 124 Staniford St., on March 1st, and upon entering the office of house at that point heard voice talking over telephone saying, "Yes,

this is Mr. Barron talking". When subject left the telephone, Agent requested him to accompany him to this principal's room, which he did. On the wall, Agent saw original discharge paper of THOMAS F. BARRON; this discharge is attached to original copy of this report.

Upon examination, it was learned that the name had been scratched out and subject's name substituted. Agent explained his business to subject, and asked why he changed name on the discharge papers of his brother. He stated it was easier for him to get around and obtain employment when they knew he was an ex-service man; that it also helped him when there was large gatherings, to show that he was not a slacker and that he served in the war. He stated that he is 22 years of age; is married; his wife lives with her folks at Lancaster, N.H. His wife's maiden name was Ruby J. Benton. Subject is a member of the H.W. Longfellow Lodge, #82, Brotherhood of Railroad Men, Portland, Me., and is at present working for the Boston & Maine Railroad under yardmaster George Lamb. Agent then requested subject to accompany him to Bureau office where the matter was gone over with Special Agent in Charge Letherman. Subject stated that the medals which Agent is forwarding to Washington under separate cover as requested in letter of Lt. Col. Kendall, were in his trunk and that he would request his wife to send them to him. The medals were handed to Agent on March 3d, and subject was instructed to report any change of address which he might make to this office so that if prosecution was to be instituted in this case he could be located.

Subject stated that he did not know the present whereabouts of his brother, nor did he know whether he was alive or not; that he was

During the war he was wounded on July 1st, 1916 in the neck and lip, but I am unable to say whether this wound has left a scar. He is inclined to be stoop shouldered and walks with a bit of a slouch.

The enquiry to which I am referring is in connection with his two war medals, his Discharge Certificate, and his Field Pay Book (A.B. 64). A doubt has been raised as to whether Thomas F. Barron has received these medals, etc., or whether they have been received by his brother, Joseph M. Barron. In connection with this doubt it will be necessary for me to state that Thomas F. Barron was married in England, but apparently was not on happy terms with his wife at any time. However, she accompanied him to this country, but owing to disagreement she did not live with him here and returned to England about the end of May, 1920. Since then she has written at different times to know if we could find his address. In Sept. 1921 a letter was received by this Dept. (original attached marked "B") presumably signed by Thomas F. There is a matter which this office is anxious to get some information about. I have spoken to the United States Consul here, Mr. James S. Benedict, and he has advised that if I address my enquiry to you, you would be good enough to instigate the necessary investigation, or pass this letter to the Mayor or Sheriff of Cumberland Mills, Maine. Naturally, any expenses incurred in connection with this matter will be met immediately on receipt of your advice.

The subject of this enquiry is Thomas Frank Barron, late Royal Newfoundland Regiment, Regimental Number 568. I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 15th March-
W.W.G.-AS/62-4680 - and enclosures, in relation to your investigation
in the case of Thomas F.Barron and Joseph M.Barron. I have to thank
you for the attention your Department has given to the matter. Not
only the Discharge paper was altered, but the regimental number and
initials on the medals were filed out, and an attempt made to scratch
in others. I have since endeavoured to discover if the wife of
Thomas F.Barron has had any trace of him, but nothing of his
whereabouts can be learnt.

Before your investigation was commenced a further letter had
been received, signed "T.F.Barron", asking for an issue of regimental
buttons, shoulder badges, and cap badge. It is believed the writer
is Joseph M.Barron, as the Postal address given and the writing are
the same as on previous letters.

Joseph M.Barron forwarded to this Department from 124 Staniford
Street, Boston, his brother's Army Pay Book, which has been duly received

It would appear that Joseph M.Barron has been guilty of
(1) forgery, (2) false personation, (3) theft, (4) tampering with mail
matter, and (5) wilfully damaging and destroying the property of
another. I am informed by the Department of Justice here that this
Department is unable to take any legal action, even to the extent of
obtaining a refund for the cost of issuing new medals. (Over)

Presumably J.M.Barron is a naturalized American citizen, and if furthermore, the acts were committed in the United States. If your Department has no further use for the original papers forwarded under cover of my letter of 26th January, I should be glad to have them returned in due course.

Your Department will know best whether it is desirable to acquaint the War Veterans' Bureau, and the Brotherhood of Railroad Men that Joseph M.Barron is not an ex-service man. This Department has no further action to take.

I thank you again for your assistance in this matter, and will forward a draft for expenses incurred on receipt of your advice.

Your letter of April 21st forwarding copy of letter from the wife of the above mentioned soldier, has been duly received. Incidentally, Mrs. Barron is not employed in this Department.

Following your telegram to the Colonial Secretary a few days ago, I informed him of the action taken by this Department and others on behalf of Mrs. Barron. On arrival in this country she refused to land with her husband; arrangements were made by this Department for the Rev. W. Clayton to put her up for the first night here. On the next day the W.P.A. took her on their hand, and Mrs. Browning secured work for her as a general servant at the Balsem House. She remained there less than twenty four hours, and then turned up in my office asking for assistance. In view of the fact that she stated she had had three years experience in cigarette packing a position was secured for her in that capacity with the Imperial Tobacco Company, and a boarding house was found for her where it was thought she would be comfortable, and still not have to pay a high rate. If she were doing full time at the Factory she could earn, with her experience \$8 to \$10 a week, while her boarding house expenses are \$4.50 per week plus \$1.50 per week for lunches at the Factory restaurant. At these rates she could at least live fairly comfortable. But she states that she unable to work full time. However, there is no possibility, as far as can be foreseen, of her becoming a charge on public charity.

She persistently refuses to live with her husband, and has applied to this Department two or three times for assistance to return to England. Of course it will be appreciated that it is rather a delicate subject to be a party to sending her back without Barron's consent, apart from the fact that there is no existing authority for Government money to be spent in this way. She is still employed in the Factory and appears very dissatisfied; and if it is possible to have her sent home in spite of the circumstances outlined above, I think it is possible that an endeavour will be made to secure her passage. In any case if anything of this nature is done eventually, Mrs. Barron will be made to clearly understand that she has no further claim in any way for further consideration

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of 30th April forwarding telegram received from the High Commissioner, London in relation to the case of the wife of No. 568 Ex-Pts. T.J. Barron.

In connection with this case I would state for your information that there is apparently some private dispute between these two. When the ship arrived in St. John's, Mrs. Barron refused to leave with her husband, and this Department arranged with Captain Clayton to take her in for that night. On the following the W.P.A. were communicated with, and Mrs. Browning secured a position for Mrs. Barron as a general servant at the Balsam House. Mrs. Barron reported there at 6.30 p.m. one day and left at 3 o'clock the following day. On that day she turned up in my office and asked to have her passage to England arranged. It was of course explained that that was not possible. She stated that she refused with her husband or with his people, and intended to do her best to get to her home in London as soon as possible.

On the same day I secured employment for her at the Imperial Tobacco Factory where she is able to earn between \$9.00 and \$11.00 per week; she already had, according to her statement, about three years experience in cigarette packing, and the work was congenial. I also arranged with the Manager of the Tobacco Factory to engage a boarding house for her, and this was secured with Mrs. Doyle, King's Bridge Road. I think she has to pay \$4.50 per week for board and lodgings, and in view of these facts her statement that she is destitute is not correct.

Her statement that she was deserted by her husband is not correct; Barron himself appears very anxious that she should go and live with him. While she continues in her present employment it does not seem at all possible that she will become a permanent charge on Newfoundland Government.

She has since written me again asking that I should arrange her passage to England, and I have replied that this is not possible for this Department to do.

I hope you won't be offended by me writing to you but could you help me to get home to England again as I am having a hard time of it out here, I am not with my husband Mr. Barron, I am over here alone, I could not live with him he is a bad one, and I thought he would alter if I came over here with him but he is worse, he was drunk the whole time he was on the boat and the Captain had to stop serving him the drink. Sir, I am stopping at a Boarding-house now, and I have started work over here for 6 dollars a week and I have got to pay 5 dollars 50 cents for my board, that will leave me about 2/6d in our money to clothe myself. Dear Sir, I would not care if I had any friend over here but I am all alone and I can't understand the People over here if you would help me to get back again I would try and pay you back when I get work in England. Dear Sir, if I could work my passage back I should be thankful, so could you try and help me as I am over here with nothing my husband gave me nothing, I have not had a penny from him and I have no clothes, all I have is what I stand up in; so please help me, if it was not for my Mother and all at home I would not trouble you I would willing end my life as I have nothing to live for now away from everybody, but I know you will help me. They have told me it is £25 to get back again. Well, Sir, if you

could help me I could pay you back weekly when I get home as I shall have to do something, I shall be longing for an answer to this letter, I expect I shall have to wait for a month before hearing but I shan't mind waiting if you could help me.

I am sorry to trouble you but if I had known what my husband was I should never had come.




