The above mentioned man has called at this office and brought a letter, copy of which is attached, concerning passport and transportation for Miss Jessie McClinton, 14 Church Street, Ayr, Scotland. I should be glad if you will do anything you can to facilitate the ^{granting} ~~guarantee~~ of a passport to this lady. With reference to transportations, although she is not yet the wife of a soldier, it is thought that she might, perhaps, be classed in the same category. Bastow's letter is, I think, sufficiently explanatory, and in view of the fact that he has bought a house and fitted it up, in the hope of getting her out here at an early date, that fact is, I think, sufficient for the purposes of the Passport Department.

Miss J. McClinton has also written to this Office on the same subject.

The difficulty has arisen through the fact that many thousands of girls and women in this country have endeavoured to get passports and passages to Canada on the pretext of marrying Canadian Soldiers, thus congesting the very limited accommodation which is at present utilised for the purpose of carrying women and children to Canada.

The authorities have extreme difficulty in transporting even married women to Canada; further steps, however, will be taken by this office to get Miss McClinton home, and it is hoped they will be successful.

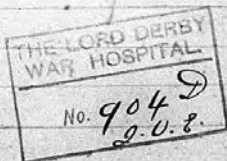


