Dear Sir.

I recieved a letter from Mr
W. H Jackman (city) in answer to one I wrote
him re my son H572 Leslie Batstone. he sends
me Dr Burdon & Gails report on the case. the
facts are this way my son was left in st Johns last fall
to take my place as I had to go home my wife was
sick. he was to undergo this operation for his head
& throat after the work was done but that was February
so he put it off untill ~~the spring~~ I could get there.
I was very sick after coming home & in fact all
or most all the winter. So the boy was left in st Johns
to listen to all the persuasion that was used on them.
and there was a great deal too much said to the boys
& we were not there to say a word to him & he was prevailed
on to join. but he has been sorry enough since he
sees how hard it is for him to stand the drill.
We have been to the capt's & majors about him they
said on account of him volunteering they cannot
discharge him unless there was something wrong
with him. and sir in spite of the Doctors report
anyone that knows my son can tell you he is
not fit for service and never able to stand any
hardship. but they tell me the Doctors passed
him but I cannot be satisfied with those Doctors
reports when I know for a fact that they have passed

others who were so delicate; one instance a relative of my wife Egbert Knight - who has been at Jensen camp since last winter. anyone who knew him was shocked to think they took him, it looks to me as tho its not what condition the boys are in its which Doctors are on for examining one Doctor will turn a man down & another will pass him. Knowing and hearing on all sides about mistakes the Doctors have made do you blame me for not being satisfied to let my boy be send overseas. we know that boy & the Doctors dont. his appearance is against him for getting discharged as a stranger would think he looked healthy but we know differently. Now I am writing this to ask you to please interfere and dont let them send this boy but get him discharged

He tell me he looks well & dont be on sick parade but he just reached a boarding house once since he joined & the Boarding mistress told my wife he was very sick there. when he was home on leave he was very sick & missed two steamers. & he have fallen suddenly twice or three times on the parade ground & another time he just reached Mrs Strong's no 5 Charlton st so sick he had to stay there 2 or 3 days he has allways had a weak back & got troubles with both his feet. my wife asked Dr Hail to examine

them & he refused. & his feet & legs never were examined. He is also a sleep walker and will get up in the night when he is tired & dress & go out dround and we are allways uneasy about him on that account, Mrs strong went at first in my place to ~~see~~ about him as I was sick & could not go & Major Carty led her to believe that all they wanted was the certificate from Dr Murphy & she got Dr Murphy to stay in his office untill the boy would get of in the evening & she got the certificate & handed it in to Major Carty & he said that was all they wanted & he would give him a board meet-dung & the chances were they would discharge him. so she wired us she expect he'd be discharged tomorrow. then Major Carty got sick & she could not see him any more so my wife at great inconvenience to her self & a lot of expence went to St Johns & had to begin all over again talking to another man Capt- Laist he knew nothing about the case at first but I understand from all of them that the boy is exempt from military duty as he is the only son. the only thing he volunteered, without our consent, my thought is the Doctors can say what the like but that boy is not fit

The suggestion contained in the letter of W.H. Jackman to the Minister of Militia as to Pte. Batstone's not getting a square deal is groundless in view of the facts of the case as stated in the attached correspondence.

I enclose all the correspondence, as I have been given a lot of trouble with this man by his people and should like the matter finally settled.



Dear Sir/-

The mother of 4572 Pte. Leslie Batstone, of Three Arms, N.D.B. called to see me today with reference to her son. She states that he saw you professionally some time in June past for advice with regard to an affliction of the head or throat, and that you advised an operation.

The mother wants me to consider the possibility of having her son discharged on medical grounds.

As far as I can understand, Pte Batstone has not undergone any operation and I can find no records of his being unfit for active service in any way. If you can remember the circumstances of the case will you kindly let me have a report as soon as possible, as it will affect his going overseas in the immediate future.

He has not complained at all, nor gone on any sick parades, to my knowledge and I cannot give the mother any satisfactory answer until I get authentic grounds to act upon.
