

Dear Sir:

I have your letter of the 2nd inst. in reference to the allotment of \$910 Hester Bennett, who was posted as "Missing" on April 14th 1917, and in November 1917 was officially presumed "Dead", which allotment was made payable to his sister Mrs. Rose L. White, of Crossroads, Stephenville. Any claim for further payment comes under the jurisdiction of the Pension Commissioners. I would, therefore, advise that Mrs. White communicate with the Board of Pension Commissioners with regard to the matter of Pension.

As to your query whether any money lies to the credit of this man in this Department, I find upon enquiry that there is a balance to the credit of his estate, the disposal of which is at present in the hands of the Minister of Justice, and we are now awaiting Letters of Administration. Upon receipt of which all monies due on this account will be immediately paid over to the person named for said Administration.

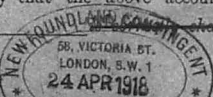
