## X-Ray Report:

**Previous Report:** Oct. 27th. 1959: Chronic bronchitis and emphysema queried secondary to pneumotoxic lung, patient giving a history of being gassed in World War I.

**Present Report:** No essential change seen. There is marked unfolding of the aorta however noted in this chest x-ray and the cardiac contour suggests left ventricular enlargement, there being some increase in heart size since last x-ray. There is no radiological sign of cardiac failure however.

## Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability
