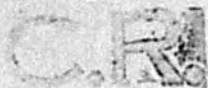

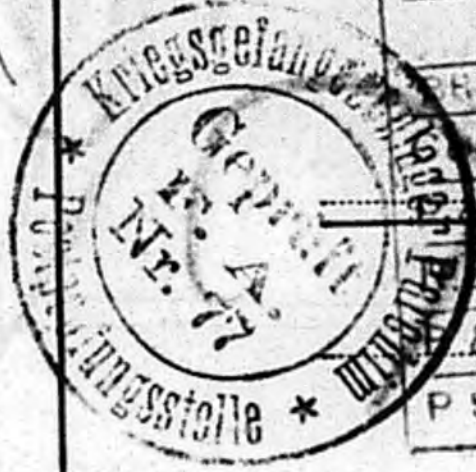



Dear Major Timewell:-

The enclosed letter addressed to No. 1738 Serjt. Jno. S. Blackall, has been returned from the Dead Letter Office to me, but he is not my son although he bears very nearly the same name. Mt lad's initials are J. F. W.; he is 2nd Lieut.; his regimental number is a different one; and ^{he} is at present a prisoner of war at Clausthal in the Hartz Mts. Serjt. Jno. S. Blackall for whom this letter is intended, is likewise I believe a prisoner of war somewhere in Germany; and you may be able to get this letter to him; but perhaps it had better be ^{censored} censored before being sent on to him.

While writing to you I beg to put before you, and most

respectfully too, a proposition: Several letters addressed to my own son, 2nd Lieut. J. F. W. Blackall, sent C/o N'f'l'd Pay & Record Office, and reaching the Pay & Record Office on or about, and shortly after the time that he was reported missing in May, were sent back to me in the same way that this letter of Jno. S. Blackall's was sent back- stamped on the envelope, as this one is, reported missing. This seems to me to be a mistake, and in my case a very annoying one. It occurred to me that it was a ~~very great pity~~ ^{mistake} on the part of your Department not to hold these letters for a reasonable period, say a couple of months or so, in the hope of the address of the man posted missing being located, when the letters could be forwarded in ordinary course; and I respectfully suggest that instructions be issued to your mailing department that the letters of men reported missing be not returned to the senders through the Deal Letter Office until they have lain in your Department for a reasonable time. In the majority of cases when a man is reported missing his address is found in the course of 6, 7 or 8 weeks, and then the letters can go forward and how welcome they would be.

I have received your letter of 23/1/18 (1761) and have forwarded the enclosure to No. 1738 Sergt. Blackall. ✓

I note your remarks about letters for missing soldiers.

At one time such letters were immediately referred to the Dead Letter Office, in accordance with regulations, but the ruling was soon found to be impracticable in the case of Newfoundlanders, and they are now kept in this Office for three months pending further news of the addressees. There are one thousand of such letters here at the present time, which are gone through periodically.

In the case of the letter which you returned, Sergt. Blackall was not known in this Office to be a Prisoner of War until almost three months had elapsed after he was posted as missing.

Nevertheless I am obliged to you for your suggestion and which supports the course taken.

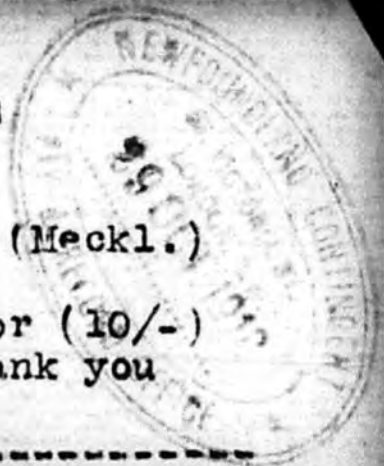
