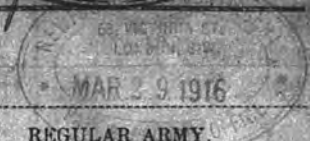

Class 3.—Disability 60 per cent and less than 80 per cent.

Class 4.—Disability 40 per cent and less than 60 per cent.

Pension 40 per cent of Class 1.

For example—Loss of one eye.

Class 5.—Disability 20 per cent and less than 40 per cent.

Pension 20 per cent of Class 1.

For example—Loss of one thumb.

Anchylosis of elbow, knee, shoulder, wrist or ankle.




