With reference to your letter 4/12/17 (191): It is rather difficult to give an expression of opinion on the question of what amount may be sufficient to meet a Prisoner's requirements, as this would be governed largely by the district in which the Soldier is interned.

It may be mentioned that Pte. Bradbury is already in receipt of a monthly remittance from this Office of 10/- out of his pay, and sufficient food and clothing parcels are being forwarded for his needs. So far he has not acknowledged any of the remittances forwarded through this Office. Advice of the remittances received and ~~forwarded~~ are being forwarded to him to-day, and he has been asked to advise whether he has received any of the amounts sent.

The circumstances under which money may be remitted to Prisoners of War, and other information, is transmitted from time to time to Department of Militia as received, and it is suggested you may find it useful to avail of the Services of that Department in such matters.

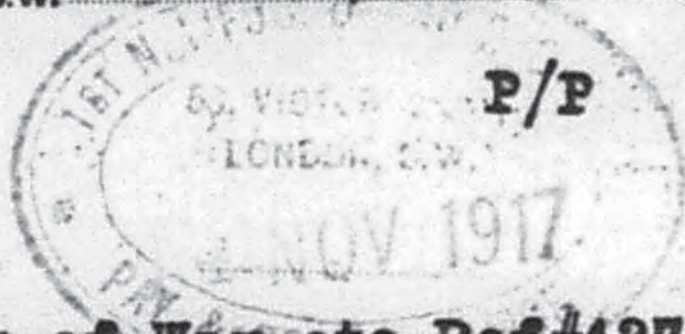



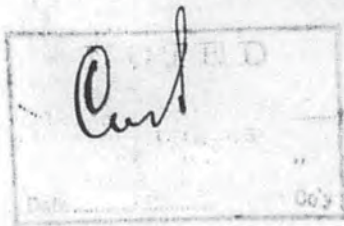

REMITTANCES TO PRISONERS OF WAR.

With reference to your letter 5/10/17, citing the case of 2781, Pte. E. Bradbury: I have the honour to state that there is no restriction respecting the remitting of money by relatives to Prisoners of War in Germany. It is, however, recommended by the War Office that remittances should not exceed £2. 0. 0. and should not be remitted more frequently than at intervals of 1 to 2 weeks.

To ensure that this may be carried out it may be advisable to arrange that all remittances be forwarded through one channel when such remittances could be regulated so as to allow the maximum amount per week to be remitted regularly.

The Central Prisoners of War Committee state that eye glasses may be forwarded provided that metal rims etc. are not made of either gold or silver. They also suggest that they should be packed in a food parcel to prevent breakage.

If this latter suggestion is approved the glasses could be forwarded to the Hon. Secretary, N. W. G. A., who would attend to this matter.

The maximum amount allowed to a Prisoner of War out of his pay is fixed at 10/- per month, this being approximately 2/6 per week as contemplated in Secretary of State for the Colonies letter No. 755, 30/10/16 to H. E. the Governor, a copy of which is doubtless in your possession.

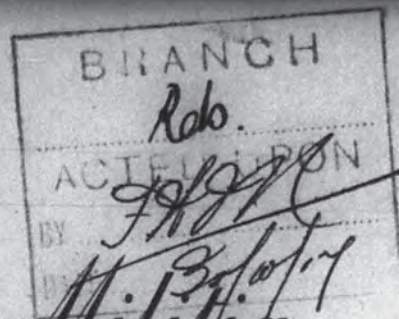

She laid before me correspondence in which it would appear that no special difficulties are experienced in transferring money to Prisoners of War.

I shall be glad to have any late information you may have to give with regard to transfer of money as the question comes up from time to time here.

The relatives of this soldier are desirous of forwarding to him a pair of eye glasses. The optician here has the number of the glasses and the only question arises is whether the articles are allowed to be forwarded.

The question of metal rims, supports, etc. might be a factor, and if these were not allowed the glasses could, perhaps, be forwarded without attachments and set up in Germany.

I shall be glad to have what information you can procure in relation to this matter.

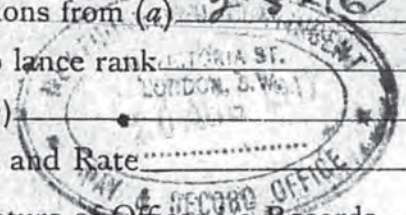
