I am in receipt of your letter of 26th instant having reference to the proposed treatment of the grave of #1186 Malcolm Bradbury.

I wish to state that it is in no way compulsory that the graves of deceased soldiers should be surrounded by the concrete curb and marked by the I.W.G.C. headstone. The wish of the Government and of the I.W.G.C. is to treat all such graves alike, and it would then be a charge on the Government for all time to see that such graves are kept in good order and condition. In this matter we can only put the case before the next-of-kin and abide by their wishes. If on further consideration you should desire to move the present monument to some other point such as the interior of the Church where it would take the place of a Tablet, so as to have the curb and I.W.G.C. stone placed and the grave sodded, you have only to notify me of your wishes in this respect. But if you wish the grave to remain as a private grave, your decision is final.

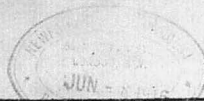
