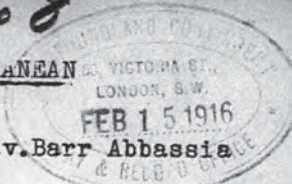

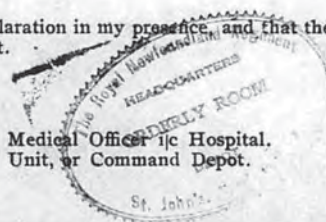

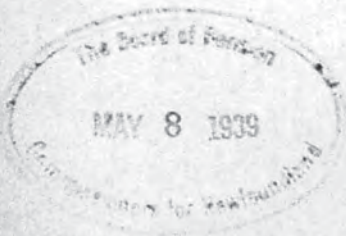

I beg to quote hereunder the details for which the DISTINGUISHED CONDUCT MEDAL, was awarded your brother #1368 Corporal Matthew Brazil, M.M. Royal Newfoundland Regiment. Taken from supplement to the LONDON GAZETTE.

"For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. On the 14th., October 1918 during the advance from LEDGEM towards the LYS. all this N. C. O's platoon except himself and one man had become casualties, and they had attacked themselves to the platoon on their left. When the attack was temporarily held up by four field guns firing at very close range this N. C. O. went forward with the platoon which was attempting to outflank the guns. When the platoon could advance no further on account of the fire from the guns and the Machine Guns, Lance Corporal Brazil and another man voluntarily doubled forward with a Lewis Gun by short rushes under intense fire from one gun and four Machine Guns until they reached a position well on the left flank.

On Arriving there, while the other man opened fire with his Lewis Gun, Lance Corporal Brazil fired with his rifle. Under this covering fire the platoon was able to advance and finally capture the four field guns and four Machine Guns. It was entirely due to Lance Corporal Brazil's dash and bravery that the platoon was able to advance and capture the hostile guns, and enable the advance to push forward.
