## MEMORIALS ON SAILORS' AND SOLDIERS' GRAVES ABROAD.

In all the lands where the forces of the Empire have been engaged during the war lie buried the bodies of thousands of our comrades, sailor's and soldiers, who have died for liberty and right. The Empire takes it as a sacred obligation that their graves shall be preserved inviolate through future ages as well as adorned with such monuments as shall most fittingly honour their memory and perpetuate the ideals for which they fell.

The Imperial War Graves Commission, recently constituted by Royal Charter under the Presidency of H.R.H. the Prince of Wales, representing all parts of the British Empire, has been charged with the responsibility for carrying out this work. It has laid down for a guiding principle that in the treatment of the graves no distinction should be made between officers and men.

The Commission feels that it would be inadvisable to leave the provision of memorials to private initiative. If memorials were allowed to be erected in the War Cemeteries according to the preference, taste, and means of relatives or friends, the result would be that costly monuments put up by the well-to-do over their dead would contrast unkindly with those humbler ones which would be all that poorer folk could afford. Thus, the inspiring memory of the common sacrifice made by all ranks would be obscured, and the cemeteries would lose that regularity and orderliness most becoming the resting-places of soldiers who fought and fell side by side, and would, in the end, grow to be ill-assorted collections of individual monuments.

The governing consideration which has influenced the Commission's decision is that those who have given their lives are members of one family, and children of one mother who owes to all an equal tribute of gratitude and affection, and that, in death, all, from General to Private, of whatever race or creed, should receive equal honour under a memorial which should be the common symbol of their comradeship and of the cause for which they died.

To carry out this principle the Commission has decided that in cemeteries, where circumstances admit, each grave shall have its own regimental headstone, which will be uniform in height, though not necessarily in design, with the others. The headstones of each regiment, however, will be of the same pattern and material. On the stone will be inscribed the appropriate religious emblem, the number, name, rank, regiment, and date of death, with the regimental badge and perhaps a national emblem. Thus, all officers and men of the same regiment will rest under headstones of their own regimental pattern. The regiments themselves—British, Dominion, Indian, and from all other parts of the Empire—have been invited to obtain designs for these headstones from their own officers and men which will be approved by a committee of artists.

and architects appointed by the Commission. Copies of the approved designs will be sent to the relatives concerned.

Special arrangements are made for dealing with the graves of those soldiers of the Indian portion of the Empire who have fallen, so that the religious requirements of all creeds and castes shall be complied with.

In addition to headstones over individual graves, the Commission has decided that each cemetery should contain a monument or monuments of a general character.

The Commission has not come to these decisions without careful enquiry among those now fighting at the Front who know the particular difficulties connected with the arrangement of cemeteries and the conditions under which burials take place. The comrades of the fallen are perhaps best able to give expression to the sentiment and spirit that it is desired to embody. Their wish would undoubtedly be that if they themselves were to be killed, their graves should be treated alike without distinction of rank.

While the Commission has decided to deal thus with all graves in war zones abroad it fully sympathises with the natural desire for private and personal memorials to the dead; but it holds that the most fitting place for these is at home, where they would be remembrances for all time to the descendants of the fallen and visible witness to the great cause for which this generation was content to die.
