Further to this Office letter of the 8th instant, the Medical Officer-in-charge of the above named man's case report as follows:-

"This patient has had a large aural polyp removed and there is still some granulation tissue which is being treated. Mr. Chubb would have carried out R.Rad.Mastoid on account of the recurrence of these polypi but owing to the fact that the man is a diabetic this was not considered feasible. Pensioner Brodnick has been advised to seek treatment at a Civil Hospital for his Diabetes but appears unwilling to do so. As soon as it is considered his ear is sufficiently clean to warrant his discharge he will be sent out, which should now be at an early date. His condition is as when he was admitted, certainly no worse".
