Medical Report on the death of:-

5931. Pte Brown George.  
Newfoundland Regt.  
Age 19. Service 2/12.

The above named man was admitted to Military Hospital, Kimmel Park on 21/10/18 in a grave condition - temperature 103.2 - respirations 24 - pulse 100. A few rales and rhonchi scattered through lungs and patches of fine crepitations. Complained of headache - cough and soreness of chest - was apathetic and drowsy - Broncho-Pneumonia diagnosed - Hot mustard bath and Brandy ordered.

He made no real improvement and on 26/10/18 it was noticed that the mucus rales were coarser, more general, and that fine crepitations were increasing.

He gradually became more cyanosed - more apathetic and respirations increased to 40 - 50 and pulse rate varied from 130 to 140 - weak and thready. Heart tonics and stimulants and Oxygen were administered but he died of heart failure 1645 on 2/11/18.

The cause of death was Broncho-Pneumonia attributable to exposure to infection while on military service during the present war.

The above named man was admitted to Military Hospital, Kinmel Park on 21/10/18 in a grave condition - temperature 103.2 - respirations 24 - pulse 100. A few rales and rhonchi scattered through lungs and patches of fine crepitations. Complained of headache - cough and soreness of chest - was apathetic and drowsy - Broncho-Pneumonia diagnosed - Hot mustard bath and Brandy ordered.

He made no real improvement and on 26/10/18 it was noticed that the mucus rales were coarser, more general, and that fine crepitations were increasing.

He gradually became more cyanosed - more apathetic and respirations increased to 40 - 50 and pulse rate varied from 130 to 140 - weak and thready. Heart tonics and stimulants and Oxygen were administered but he died of heart failure 1645 on 2/11/18.

The cause of death was Broncho-Pneumonia attributable to exposure to infection while on military service during the present war.


