Dear Sir:

Private Selby Budden #5634 of Jackson's Arm, White Bay, has consulted us with regard to his position in the Regiment, which is somewhat of a peculiar nature. We have advised him that as he is now a member of the Regiment his proper course would be to report for duty, and state his case to the Militia Authorities, to be dealt with by them. Meanwhile he has asked us to lay the matter before you, with a view to securing him a further extension of leave to return home and finish his work. The facts of his case, so we are instructed, are briefly as follows:

Private Budden enlisted early last May, before the Conscript-ion Act was passed, was accepted as medically fit and was sworn in. He did duty for about a week and then was granted leave for a month to return home and finish some work he had on hand. His leave has now expired and he has returned to duty. In the mean-time, however, owing to weather conditions and lack of water to drive his logs, he has been unable to do the work he returned to do. Moreover while he was at home his father met with a serious

accident which has totally incapacitated him . He went to St. Anthony for treatment, but was informed by the Doctor therethat nothing could be done for him.

Private Budden, who is the only unmarried member of the family, is thus the only support of his parents, who are both sixty six years of age, and unless he can obtain an extension of leave, his parents will not be able to harvest their crops, and will lose the value of the logs now waiting to be sawn.

Private Budden has asked us to make this explanation, not that he wishes to evade his duty in any way, but because he did not feel competent himself to explain matters fully.

We feel sure that this matter will have your fullest consideration, and trust that it will be possible to secure for our client a further extension of leave so that he may return to his home and see that his parents are properly provided for.

I find that he was granted leave on June 15th for one month and did not report back to Headquarters until August 5th, thus being absent a month and a half. I understand that the delay was mostly owing to the difficulty of transportation from his home in White Bay.

As the class is reporting for duty on September first, it will be impossible to extend leave beyond that date, as it would take considerable time to reach his home and return, it is regretted that further leave cannot be granted. Had Pte. Budden taken the matter up while he was home, doubtless it could have been arranged, but, having returned to duty, suitable arrangements cannot be made for any new leave to be granted.
