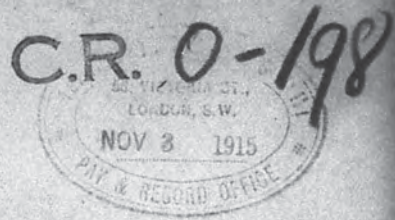

Reference your letter dated 29th April, 1915, I was appointed to the Command, Newfoundland Contingent, by War Office Gazette dated 13th November, 1914. It was not decided who should pay my pay and allowances for some time. At first Cox & Co. sent a Last Pay Certificate to me but you did not pay me my pay which fell months in arrear. Then Cox & Co. credited me with pay but not Command pay or allowances in accordance with R. W. and Allowance Regulations. On applying to Scottish Command Paymaster he refused to comply with the latter part of your letter quoted above. On the 17th May I therefore wrote and requested that Command Pay and Allowances should be paid to me in accordance with your letter, and letter 78546/23 F 2, Dated 28th May, 1915, was received from the Assistant Financial Secretary authorizing me to be paid from the date of that letter (28 May).

I now have the honour to request that 5/- Command Pay and usual allowances of a Lieut.-Colonel from the date of my assuming command of the Newfoundland Contingent on the 14th November, 1914, may be paid to me. With reference R. W., para. 248, and Allowance Regulations, it is not understood on what ground these allowances are withheld, and it



I should be obliged if you would please send me copy of the last letter you wrote me with regard to my claim for Command allowance. From memory I understood that it had been arranged that on resubmitting my application the allowance would be paid; but on recently applying from Egypt to the Command Paymaster, Scottish Command, it is still withheld. Command allowance at 5/- per day is claimed by me from the 14/11/14 to 27/5/15 under the Allowance Regulations or Canadian Pay Regulations. The numbers under me were never less than 540 & increased to 1452. There was no second in Command. Extra work was on hand in training all ranks - selecting Officers & NCOs for promotion - there were an unusual number of moves - and an unusual amount of equipment work owing to the constant changes. The matter has fallen into arrears owing to the War Office order that I should be paid by the Newfoundland Government not being adhered to by you & subsequently owing to the Command Paymaster, Scottish Command withholding
