

REPORT PRIVATE BUTLER NUMBER 460.

Right ear has had a persistent otitis media with necrosis of bone involving the upper and inner wall of the auditory canal and in the tympanum. When first examined, a considerable amount of granulation-tissue was present. This condition is remedied, the ear being free from discharge, necrosis, or granulation-tissue. Hearing practically gone, or 1/20. Left ear otitis media with perforation of drum, and thickening. The profuse mucopurulent discharge has entirely disappeared. Hearing 1/10.

## Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability

**INSTRUCTIONS**—This form is to be completed in the case of every discharged soldier whose claim to pension, on account of disability, is to be submitted for the consideration of the Pensions and Disabilities Board.

This section should be completed in the Hospital at which a man is attending at the time of his examination by a Medical Board, or, if the man is not in Hospital, by the Medical Officer of the Unit or Command Depot. The Soldier should be given a full opportunity of examining it, as, if awarded a pension, his subsequent identification depends on his confirming this declaration. The "Rank," "Station," and "Date" should be in his own handwriting.
