I have been talking to some of our original Officers and they are of the opinion that we should be entitled to something as we have spent our original kit allowance many times over. Another matter I should like to have explained is Would gratuities for Officers of our Unit. In English Regiments Officers receive various amounts for injuries received on Service. My right arm has been knocked about rather badly this time and under the regulations of the British Army I am entitled to Compensation. Will you please let me know if any arrangements have been made in connection with this in our contingent.

The matter of Wound Gratuities was taken up with the Pensions and Disabilities Board and a reply has been received copy of which is enclosed for your information.

With reference to the case of Outfit, Allowance it is regretted that no further Allowance can be made in this respect at Present time.

The Copy of your letter has been submitted to the Minister of Militia With regard to Wound Gratuities previous applications submitted to the Newfoundland Patriotic Association elicited the following reply:-

I am advised by the pensions board to point out that the position appears to be this. In England Officers as well as men, receive a lower rate of pay than that which prevails in Canada. To partly compensate for this low rate of pay, British Officers under certain conditions receive wound gratuities. We have adopted in Newfoundland the Canadian rate of Pay, and therefore such wound gratuities are not provided for, any more than they are in Canada. In view of the fact therefore, the Pensions Board respectfully recommends that the correspondence be returned to the Governor-General with a view to the

no provision is made for gratuities for wounds, and that applications therefore cannot be recognised.



"With regard to wound Gratuities, previous application submitted to the Newfoundland Patriotic Associatio elicited the following reply,-

I am desired by the Pensions Board to point out that the position appeard to be this. In England, Officers, as well as men, receive a lower rate of pay than that which prevails in Canand. To partly compensate for this low rate of pay, British Officers under certain conditions, receive wound gratuities. We have adopted in Newfoundland the Canadian rate of pay, and therefore suck wound gratuities are not provided for, any more than they are in Canada. In view of this fact, therefore, the Pensions Board respectfully recommends that the correspondence be returned to Major Timewell, through His Excellency the Governor, with an intimation that no provision is made for gratuities for wounds, and that applications therefore cannot be recognised.

With reference to your letter 13/3/18 (2514):- No instructions have been received at this Office with regards an additional grant of Outfit Allowances for Officers who have been on Service over three years. The copy of your letter has been submitted to the Minister of Militia for consideration.

With regard to Wound Gratuities, previous application submitted to the Newfoundland Patriotic Association, elicited the following reply,-

"I am desired by the Pensions Board to point out that the position appears to be this. In England, Officers, as well, as men, receive a lower rate of pay than that which prevails in Canada. To

partly compensate for this low rate of Pay, British Officers under certain conditions, receive wound gratuities. We have adopted in Newfoundland the Canadian rate of Pay, and therefore such wound gratuities are not provided for, any more than they are in Canada. In view of this fact, therefore, the Pensions Board respectfully recommends that the correspondence be returned to Major Timewell, through his Excellency the Governor, with an intimation that no provision is made for gratuities for wounds, and that applications therefore cannot be recognised."





With reference to your letter (8963) received to-day: I am informed by the War Office that there will not likely be an Investiture for some weeks. If not towards the end of this month, the next one will probably be early in September.

So soon as you inform me when you can proceed to Newfoundland, I will be delighted to make the necessary arrangements. It will be advisable to have a passport, and of course your wife must have one. The cost of the latter's passage to Newfoundland is admissible by the N.F. Government, provided that she does not return to this country, or if she does, it will be at her own expense.

Do I understand that you are to take advantage of the 6 weeks

special 'Blue Puttee' leave, or are you proceeding to St. John's for duty there? I expect, however, you will refer to Winchester before making your plans. which you should kindly complete and return to this office as early as possible, with the sum of 5/- to cover cost of Passport. The same Passport will suffice for yourself and your wife, the other form only applies to Mrs. Butler.

It is, of course, essential that you obtain the sanction of the War Office before leaving England, (which might be got by this office) and it would be advisable for you to come to London to make the necessary arrangements. Doubtless you will confer with the O.C. 2nd Bn. before leaving *this Country*.

It does not necessarily follow that you will embark at Liverpool, it may be either at Southampton or London. In the meantime, however, nothing will be lost by getting your papers under way.
