I am not aware of any "arrangements" made by the Bandmaster other than the information he invariably gives to prospective Bandsmen before they enlist as to their rate of pay and allowances in this Contingent which presumably this Bandsman can obtain from you if he chooses to comply with the necessary formalities required.
