" Havre 5th June, 1918 "

20th Nov. 1917

" I saw him lying dead beside a sunken road on the Cambrai Front. I went up and took his paybook from him and gave it to the Company Officer. I believe the Officer was Lieut. Clewitt. Carew had dark hair, clean shaven, tall-nearly six feet-I should think-, broad in proportion about 29."

Dear Sir:-

With further reference to your letter of Feb. 12th, and our reply of Feb. 19th saying that a message was being despatched to the other side to have enquiries set on foot to locate Privates Shannahan and Canning and examine them as to their knowledge of the death of your son, Private 1560 Victor Carew, I have the honour to inform you that we are now in receipt of reply from the Record Office, London stating that the Officer Commanding 1st Battalion could only locate Shannahan who stated that he knew nothing of the matter excepting that Private Canning had told him that he had found the body of your son. Private Canning, unfortunately, has been evacuated severely wounded.

Your doubtless realize the difficulty there is in tracing every man after a large engagement and heavy casualties, and, though every effort is made, it is not always possible to do so.





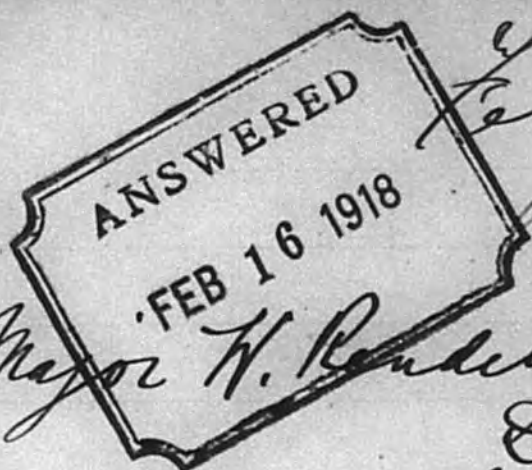

of his comrades saw him
fall or killed, that it should
not have appeared missing
(officially) would you kindly
look the matter up and relieve
a bit of his poor Mother's



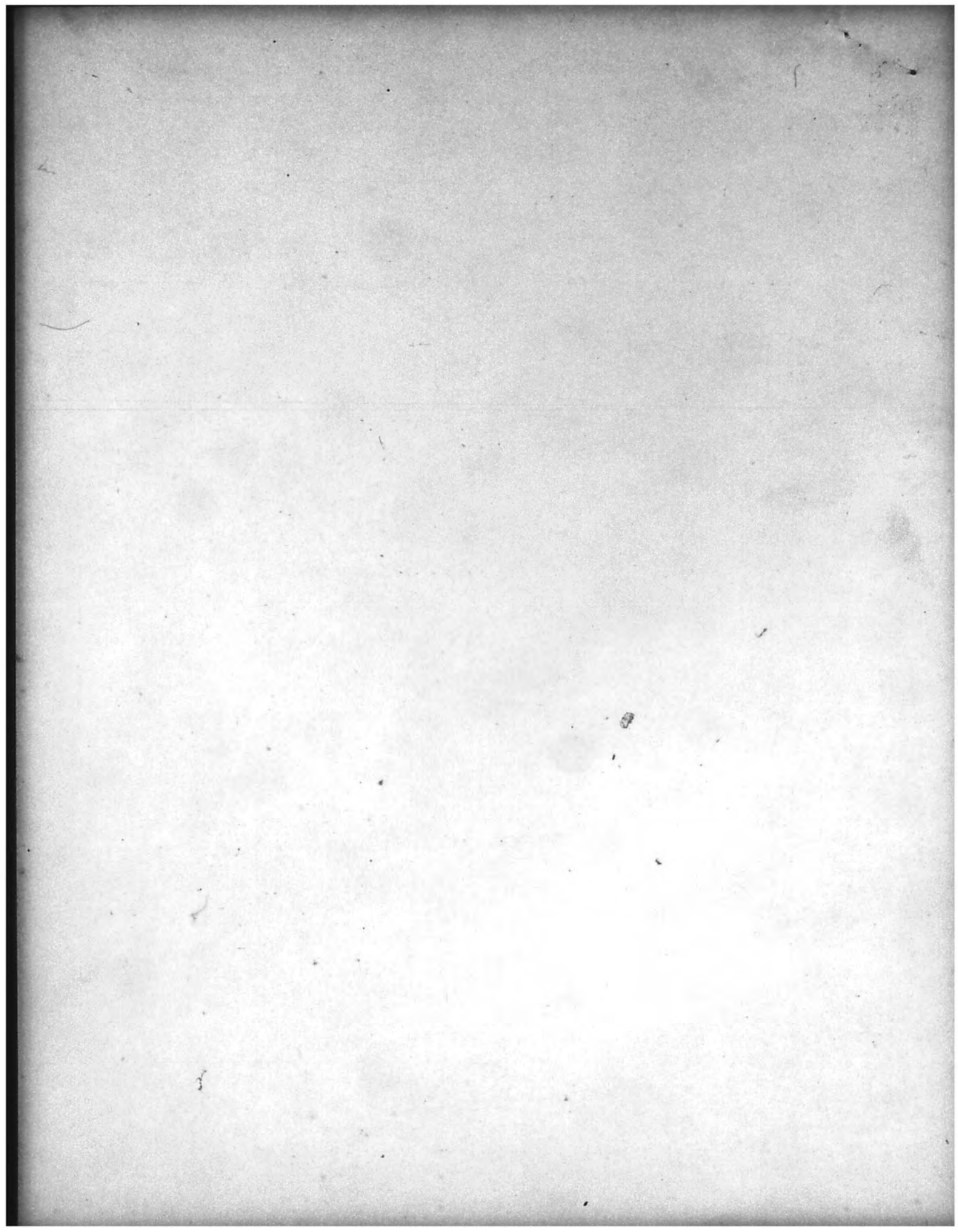
