Re Lieut. C.S. Frost

In regard to the case of Lieut. Frost, respecting whom I am sending an Official communication under another cover may I suggest to you that, if this officer's disability is sufficiently serious to warrant reasonable ground for believing that he will be unfit to resume active service, it might be better to direct him to come to St. John's and undergo his next examination; because in such a case, if held to be unfit, he would be discharged, given his pension, and return at once to his civil employment which was that of a bank clerk. If he goes back to Ayr he will probably be there for some time, then boarded, sent back via Quebec, the I.C.R. and the Reid railway to St. John's, and boarded again, and this will probably cause us an outlay of four or five hundred dollars, whereas if he were brought here direct from Yarmouth it would only mean about \$50 altogether for his passage and board for a day or two, until discharged.

Of course I do not know what ~~about~~ the nature of his injuries is and therefore cannot say whether this course would be the proper one, but I know you will give due consideration to the suggestion in the light of your knowledge of the details of his case.

Re Second Lieut. Frank Bennett.

We had this officer's papers before us at a Pension Board meeting last night and decided to pass them through Major Carty to you for his discharge, or, rather, transfer to the reserve of officers, which I understand is the official procedure of such cases, as he has been held by the doctors to be permanently unfit.

During the discussion of his case, Major Carty told us that Mr. Bennett, who is thus far on furlough, called to see him two or three days ago and asked him if he could put him on light duty, and Major Carty says he stated he could not do this as the doctors had ~~advised~~ him to be permanently unfit and recommended his discharge; but it is apparent from this that this young man would naturally like to keep on nominal service and draw \$140 a month, instead of being discharged, more especially as Dr. Fraser states that the aggravation of his disability by active service is not sufficiently great to justify any pension or allowance. I would say, however, that my remarks in regard to Lieut. Carter's case apply in this instance also, but with even greater force, because whereas Carter was on active service and wounded, Bennett was never out of England, and seeing that we have already discharged Lieut. Lumsden, who was wounded with the Canadians, Lieut. Burnham ~~was~~ was in the first of July fight; and Lieut. Burnham who though he did not go beyond Ayr, claimed to be only support of a wife and mother, it would, I think, leave the door open for very vigorous criticism if Lieut. Bennett were continued on duty at the rate of \$1680 a-year under these circumstances.

I may add that the members of the Board were unanimous in the opinion that Major Carty had taken the proper step, and that Lieut. Bennett, should be discharged and not retained.

I am embolded to make these suggestions because of your saying in your last note to me regarding the Carter case, that you were pleased that I brought the Carter matter to your notice; and I make the above suggestions in the same spirit.


I thank you for your confidential memo of this morning covering letter from Mr. H. D. Carter (father of Lieut. Cyril Carter), and having noted what the latter says regarding his son's case, I return you his letter herewith.

A | You ask me "if any claim for pay has been lodged since Lieut. Carter went on leave?" In reply I would say that I do not know. His case did not come before us in any way, and I assume that any arrangements he made was with Major Montgomerie. I might add that we have no documents whatever regarding his case. We do not know how he came out here from England and where he stands with regard to the Regiment. Sir Edgar Bowring told me that he "haunted" (Sir Edgar's own term) the Pay and Record Office last spring asking about his pension. Sir Edward Morris told me that he spoke to him about getting a passage to Newfoundland. Only Saturday night, after my speaking to you on Thursday, there was laid before the Finance sub-committee a bill which I attach, for antiseptic dressings for his wound, of which bill I may say I had no knowledge when I was speaking to you. This was referred to me to make further inquiry, not that we object to paying it, but that we want to know where we are.

All these things, I think, go to emphasize what I pointed out to you on Thursday, that there may be strong criticism if a wealthy officer is retained on pay and allowances indefinitely, when manifestly unfit to ever return to the front, while poorly-off soldiers are summarily boarded and pensioned immediately they return here.

Of course, if Lieut. Carter waives pay and allowances for an indefinite period merely for the purpose of being retained on the regimental strength, I do not know that anyone will be disposed to object; but what we want to protect ourselves from is the contingency that later on a claim may be made and may involve a large sum, as his pension -- his leg not needing disarticulation at the hip -- would be \$432 a year, whereas his pay and allowances would be \$1680 a year.

As regards drawing any pay for several weeks over the allotted leave,- that is about the first week of February- I am not aware that he has made any demand for pay since December last, and I am sure that he would not expect or accept any preferential treatment over that of his brother soldiers.

For your information, I may say that Cyril has been under medical treatment since his arrival at New York, and he has already consulted with three specialists, and they all agree on one subject, that is, the long time it will take for the wound to skin over and heal up - if it ever does- and from one he has undergone the Radium treatment, which is a very expensive and costly one; he is still in the hands of a medical man, and likely to be for some time.

If he had been sent by the medical Board, it would be a very expensive affair for the Regiment.

I think, myself, the course you suggest, is not an unreasonable one, and I am sure will be taken, on consideration, in the right way by him.

On December 27th I granted leave of absence from Newfoundland to Lieut. Carter who was desirous of proceeding to New York for special medical treatment at his own charge. (vide my Minute of December 27th to the Officer Commanding at Headquarters).

On or about January 26th I received a letter from Lieut. Carter dated from Garden City, New York, stating that his ~~wounded~~ wounded leg was improved under treatment and that he had been advised by his doctor to remain in America until the winter was over, his adviser being apprehensive lest he should damage his leg in consequence of the slippery state of the roads in St. John's.

I communicated on the subject with Major Montgomerie and he saw no objection to the extension of leave; but I do not find record of the correspondence in my office.

In view of the disabled condition of this officer from his wounds, and in order to regularise his absence from Headquarters, I desire that record should be made that leave of absence from the Colony be granted to Lieut. Carter until May 15th or such time when he is able to report himself at Headquarters.

Your letter of the 30th ultimo to hand, and I note what you say with reference to refunding me my transportation expenses.

It is regrettable that the statement I furnished last October has been lost. I find it impossible to give you an itemized statement of my expenses now, though I remember the total amount was between \$124.00 to \$125.00. If you compare this amount with ~~the~~ other officers' <sup>amounts</sup>, who have been reimbursed for their passage back, you will find it slightly higher, but, I can account for the difference, as I had to pay surgeon's expenses ~~to me~~, besides having to pay for dressing-instruments; I was also three days in Halifax waiting for "Florizel".
