I am directed to acknowledge the receipt, of your letter No. 10070/199/P & A. of the 25th. June. 1918, on the subject of an enquiry from Major P.J. With reference to the enclosed claims and copies of correspondence: my memorandum 838/1, 27/1/17, to the C.P. Base is passed to you for confirmation in view of the last sentence in minute S, C.B. 3/83/600, 15/1/17.

A.O.I. 1856, paras. 2 & 3 are apparently misinterpreted by the C.P. Base. Kindly take necessary steps to ensure settlement of the claims in question, please.

2. Letter 13/2/17, 121/Overseas/3596 (Q.M.G.F.A.) from W.O. to P & R.O.

In reply to your letter of the 3rd instant, 1030/23, Claims 78/79, I am directed to inform you that the only allowances issuable by the Command Paymaster Base, France, to officers of the Newfoundland Contingent are those in lieu of issues in kind as specified in Army Council Instruction 1856 of 1916, (paragraph 3).

The lodging, fuel and light allowances issuable to officers on British pay in France are, however, not in lieu of issues in kind, but are the special allowances granted to officers on active service by Army Order 501 of 1914. These allowances are not issuable to officers of the Newfoundland Contingent, and I am to refer you to War Office letter No. 121/Overseas/1749 (Q.M.G.F.A.) of 6th March 1916, in which a similar claim by Major W.H. Franklin was disallowed. The enclosures to your letter are returned herewith.

3. (Enc) Letter 6/3/16, 121/Overseas/1749 (Q.M.G.F.A) from W.O. to P & R.O.

With reference to certain claims for lodging, fuel and light allowances which were left at this office by Major W.H. Franklin, 1st Newfoundland Regiment, attached to 1/5th Royal Warwickshire Regiment, I am directed to enclose for your information a copy of a letter which has been sent to Major Franklin relative to his claim while in the field.

I am to add that his claim for lodging, fuel and light allowances for the period during which he was under canvas in this country is also not admissible.

His Travelling claim is still under consideration.

4. (Enc) Letter 27/2/17 from W.O. to Major W.H. Franklin.

With reference to your visit to this office of the 17th inst., relative to your claim for Lodging and Fuel and Light Allowances for the period of your presence with a British unit in the Field, I am directed to inform you that the allowances in question are admissible only for Officers on British rates of unconsolidated pay, from British Funds, and it is regretted that it is not possible to authorise them in your case.

5. Letter 16/2/17 (884) from W.O. to P & R.O.

I return the correspondence attached.

The War Office ruling (letter of 13/2/17 herein) is perfectly correct and I am sorry if we misled you on the point. The point is that the 'Lodging Fuel and Light Allowance' granted to Officers is not in lieu of issues of kind but was a special addition made to their emoluments in the nature of an increase of pay (by Army Order 501 of 1914).

I did not know that the Allowance you were speaking of was not a money allowance given in lieu of quarters and rations. Your officers are entitled to the money allowances issued in kind (as laid down by the A.O.I 1856), but 'Lodging Fuel and Light Allowance' is not the same thing.

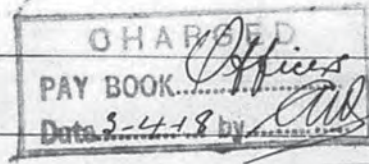

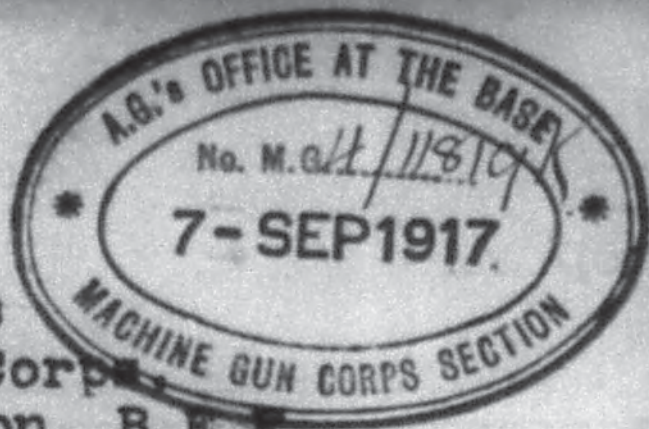



ADVANCE of PAY, CLAIMS &c.

With reference to your letter 6/2/17, kindly refer to my telegram 16/11/16 which states that advances may not be made without the sanction of the Officer Commanding.

It is also observed that the amount of £18:0:0 advanced to you against certain travelling claims is still outstanding. As agreed in my letter 16/11/16, the matter of debiting you with this amount was suspended temporarily. 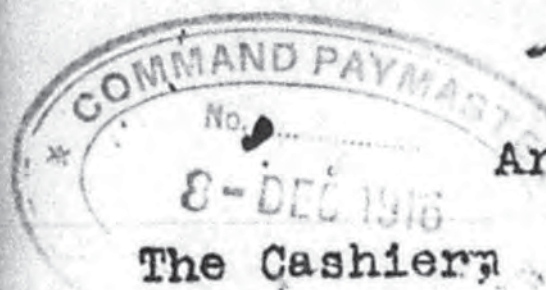

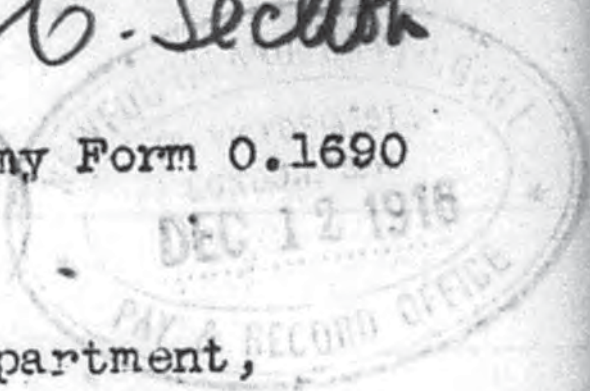
