

Dear Madam,

With reference to your message of yesterday's date, in reference to the casualty report respecting Private Charles Chuck, I beg to state that, upon his enlistment, he gave his address as Russia, and did not name any next of kin. It would appear, however, that he married subsequent to his enlistment, and as we in this Department, had no knowledge of this, we were not aware that there was any person connected with him resident in Newfoundland. This will explain why no notice of his casualty was sent to you.

As I find, upon enquiry at the Pay and Record Office here, that you are Private Chuck's wife, any further information received concerning him will be sent to you.

Mr O'Sole mentioned this matter to me recently and as a result I got in touch with the late Private Chuck's only relative - his father in law - in this vicinity.

Private Chuck is buried in his father in law's family plot in Chapel's Cove cemetery and has a very nice headstone bearing the Regimental badge and erected I think by his wife.

I enclose by your copy of instructions enclosed that

that the outside measurement of curb should be 3×8 . This plot in which Private Chuck is buried measures roughly 10×12 . His father in law is not satisfied to have a curb placed there unless it takes in the whole square.

I figure it would require not less than 3 bbls cement to build a good curb of the above size. The quantity of lumber - 200 ft - given in your circular would be ample for forms. Both cement & lumber can be procured locally at practically St. Johns prices in fact the lumber can be had much cheaper.

I am leaving by tomorrow express for the lumber and very likely won't be back for 2 weeks. On my return to town I will call to see you in connection of satisfactory

Dear Madam,

I have to advise you that we have on hand an headstone sent out by the Imperial War Graves Commission to be erected over the grave of your late husband 2496 Pte. Chas. Chuek.

With your permission, we would like to treat his grave as a War Grave, that is, we are prepared to erect a concrete curb around his grave, set the headstone in the head of the curb, and sod the plot leaving one foot of earth at the foot of the headstone for the planting of bulbs or flowers.

I understand that the body of your late husband is at present lying in your father's plot and if his consent cannot be secured perhaps you would grant us permission to exhume and place the body in a plot by itself when the work outlined above could be carried out very satisfactorily. All expenses would be met by this Department.
