2nd Lieutenants Edmund Churchill and Max Churchill reported to me this day, pursuant to orders.

I have heard their statements in defence.

(1) They have remitted by Draft the accounts for their Mess Bills for which they had tendered Cheques which were dishonoured. Their explanation is that they Expected their pay to be lodged to their credit at Ayr. This is unsatisfactory.

(2) 2nd Lieut. E. Churchill tendered an explanation regarding the irregularity in reference to the Company's accounts. I am not in possession of the full facts and cannot arrive at a fair determination. But he admitted his fault due to want of knowledge and assures me that the money has not been misappropriated and is in order. He promises amendment.

(3) 2nd Lieut. M. Churchill explained to me the personal matter for which he was reproved by the O.C. No. 2 District, Scotiam. He admitted his misconduct and expressed contrition. He stated that the matter has been closed and that he is willing to return to Ayr and never to misconduct himself while wearing The King's Uniform.

I have spoken very seriously to both these young Officers and have severely reprimanded them.

In view of their long service, both having enlisted at the first call to arms (M. Churchill's regimental number is 4 which speaks well for his readiness to serve), and taking into consideration that both had clean sheets and received their promotion through the various grades, while on active service, until they were selected for Commissions, and accepting their assurances that in future there would be no further cause for censure, I have severely reprimanded them and hope for the best.

They are now discharging their duties at the Depot at Headquarters and should be noted to go with the next Draft; and I hope that they will prove themselves to be good Officers on the field of battle.

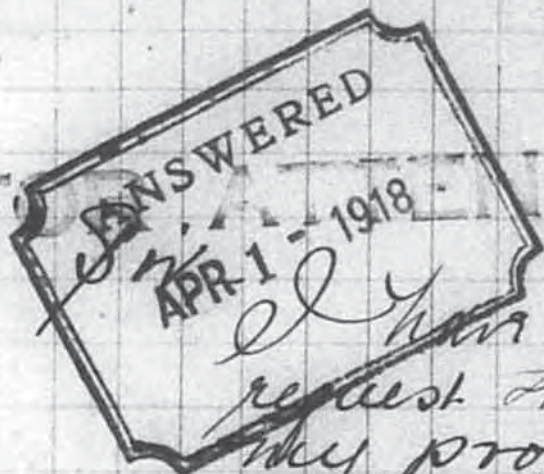

Dear Churchill;

Your letter of 24th February, has been received. It is noted that you wish to have your promotion to Lieut. antedated. In this connection I would refer you to A.C.1 1253, of 1917, which states that all 2/Lieuts. if duly recommended should be eligible for promotion to the rank of Lieut on completion of eighteen months commissioned service if they have not previously been promoted to fill a vacancy. You were commissioned as 2/Lieut, 16th August 1915, eighteen months from that date would be 16th February, 1917, you were recommended for promotion and gazetted as Lieut., on the 1st May 1917, or twelve days later than if A.C.1. 1253 was then in force. This A.C.1., was issued in August 1917. It is not clear from your letter from what date you are asking to be antedated but it seems clear that no undue hardship exists in your case.

With reference to your No.19488 dated the 22nd, I have interviewed 2nd Lt. Churchill on this subject and his explanation is as follows.

He was of the opinion that the correspondence on this subject between himself and the War Office was closed a month and a half ago.

He contends that £13 was sent by his Regtl. Paymaster to Malta to cover his deficiencies, but that the cheque for £10 had in the meantime been passed through again and met, so £9.10.11 (the difference between that and £10, representing bank charges for exchange etc.) was returned by the Bank at Palermo.

These statements are supported by his Bank pass book which I have seen, and by correspondence which passed between the Paymaster and Malta, a copy of which I enclose.

In continuation of my letter of the 5th January 1917, number as above, and with reference to War Office letter No.105/MISC:/1146 (A.G.3) of the 23rd January 1917, regarding two unpaid cheques drawn by 2nd Lt. E.Churchill, 1/1st Battalion Newfoundland Regiment, I have the honour to enclose a copy of a letter recently received from the Banca Italiana di Sconto, Palermo, to the effect that these debts are still outstanding.

From the records in this Office the following is a brief summary of the facts of the case:-

1. Whilst at Palermo 2nd Lieut. Churchill paid two cheques of £10 and £3 to the Manager, Excelsior Palace Hotel, Palermo.
These cheques were returned unpaid through Banca Italiana di Sconto, Palermo and forwarded to this Office.
2. The cheque for £10 was handed to 2nd Lieut. Churchill, who at the same time stated that he had sent £10 to the Manager, Excelsior Palace Hotel to meet the above, which amount was apparently never received by the payee.
3. According to attached letter written by the Officer Commanding 2/1st Bn. Newfoundland Regiment, 2/Lieut. Churchill contends that £13 was sent by his Regimental Paymaster to Malta.
4. Also he states that he received £10. less bank expenses, from Palermo through the Banca Commerciale Italiana, London Branch.

Can the information be given please as to which bank in Palermo forwarded this money to London and for whose account. The above facts appear to need some explanation by the Officer concerned and as the debts are presumably unpaid, I would request that you will take such action as will result in an early settlement of this case.

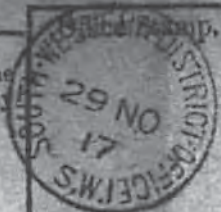





Thus an officer with three years service and over, whether entirely a commissioned officer or partly in the ranks, receives a Gratuity of 183 days Pay and Field Allowance, i.e. in the case of a Lieutenant £3.00 per day.

(If released after 1/9/18)

The Gratuity is not issuable until the officer is retired, when it is paid as follows:-

31 days Pay & Field Allowance on the date of retirement and the balance at intervals of 30 and 31 days alternately until the full amount is paid.

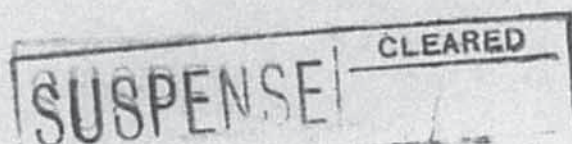



2nd Lieutenants Edmund Churchill and Max Churchill
reported to me this day, pursuant to orders.

I have heard their statements in defence.

(1) They have remitted by Draft the accounts for
their Mess Bills for which they had tendered Cheques
which were dishonoured. Their explanation is that they
Expected their pay to be lodged to their credit at Ayr.
This is unsatisfactory.

(2) 2nd Lieut. E. Churchill tendered an explanation
regarding the irregularity in reference to the
Company's accounts. I am not in possession of the full
facts and cannot arrive at a fair determination. But he
admitted his fault due to want of knowledge and
assures me that the money has not been misappropriated
and is in order. He promises amendment.

(3) 2nd Lieut. M. Churchill explained to me the
personal matter for which he was reprovved by the O.C.
No. 2 District, Scotland. He admitted his misconduct
and expressed contrition. He stated that the matter
has been closed and that he is willing to return to
Ayr and never to misconduct himself while wearing The
King's Uniform.

I have spoken very seriously to both these young Officers and have severely reprimanded them.

In view of their long service, both having enlisted at the first call to arms (M. Churchill's regimental number is 4 which speaks well for his readiness to serve), and taking into consideration that both had clean sheets and received their promotion through the various grades, while on active service, until they were selected for Commissions, and accepting their assurances that in future there would be no further cause for censure, I have severely reprimanded them and hope for the best.

They are now discharging their duties at the Depot at Headquarters and should be noted to go with the next Draft and I hope that they will prove themselves to be good Officers on the field of battle.

Dear Mr. Squires :-

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of Dec. 28th forwarding letter from Dr. Blackall in relation to the Engineering School and the machinery contained therein.

I have of course been aware of the Minute in the final report of the Civil Re-Establishment, and I note Dr. Blackall's suggestion that the place should be handed over temporarily to Lieut. Ernest Churchill.

If the decision of the Government should be that the place be retained by the Government for the purpose of technical education in the community, the suggestion of Dr. Blackall would appear to be sound, although I have been given to understand through conversation some little time ago with Dr. Blackall, that the present location of the Engineering school would not be the best suitable if it were to be used as a technical school. The result would be that when a more suitable place has been found and the machinery transferred, the building would have to be disposed of. As against this, the authorities of the Prince of Wales Rink have approached me with a view to purchasing the building, their object being to remove it nearer the rink, and fit it up and use it as dressing rooms for hockey players. In addition, applications have been received verbally in this Department, notably from the Reid Newfoundland Company for different parts of the machinery. I am inclined to think that if the Government do not sanction the educational school suggested by the Civil Re-Establishment Committee, that all the machinery down there could be disposed of at once at reasonable figures, and that the building also could be disposed of immediately.

As far as I am at present aware, the only things that might not be sold at prices that might not be desired would be the three motor cars which were used for instructional purposes. These cars were bought at a very cheap figure and have been of invaluable service in the training of motor mechanics and chauffeurs, and even if disposed of at a loss, I think, perhaps, \$200.00 per car less than the price paid, would be the most that would be dropped.

To dispose of this engineering school and its contents, is one of the matters which would facilitate the eventual closing up of this Dept; and, incidentally, would save to the Government the salary of the watchman now employed, which is \$70.00 per month, as well as the insurance on building and contents.

Subject, therefore, to the decision of the Government, I would:-

- (1) Support Dr. Blackall's recommendation, or
- (2) Recommend the immediate disposal by sale of both building and contents

I am returning Dr. Blackall's letter herewith please.


