I must inform you that No. 3643 Pte. George Clark who is now with 2/1st Nfld Regt., D. Coy, at Brussell Street, Ayr, enlisted against my consent and he is also under age (as I am enclosing his Baptism Certificate so you may see it plainly). Now I would like to know if he could be kept from the firing line until he came of age. Had I known I could have stopped him I would have done so until he came of age to enlist then he could have had my consent. 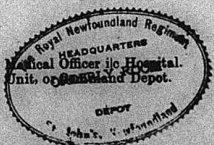
