² As regards the Messing arrangement - A certain number of Officers here, draw the allowance for Rations, instead of Rations in Kind, and this allowance is paid by the Officer into the Mess, & the money used in the up-keep of the Mess. This arrangement is in vogue in all the Camps in this area. The allowance is, however, frequently very late in arriving; and, as in the case of St. John's, Officers are often sent away from here long before it reaches them. The Mess Secretary has, therefore, to send the claims afterwards.

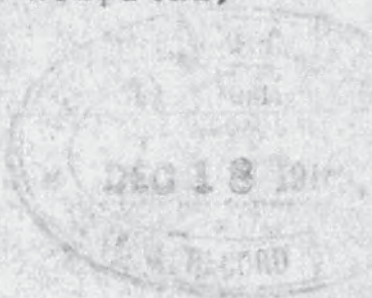



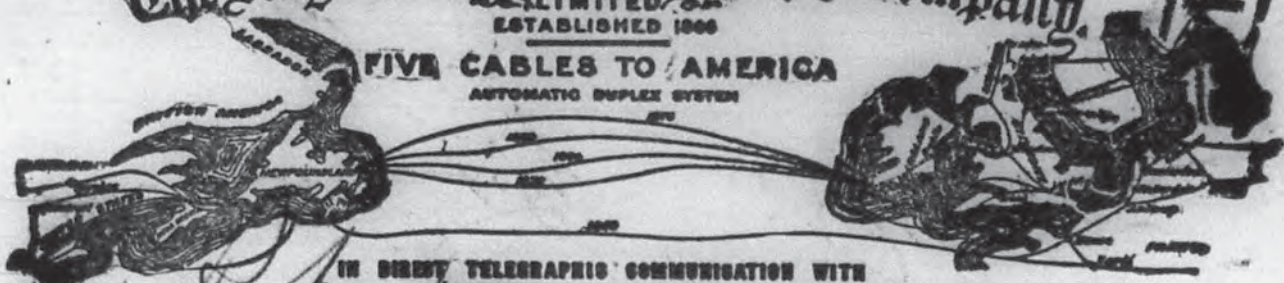
