
I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 23rd April.

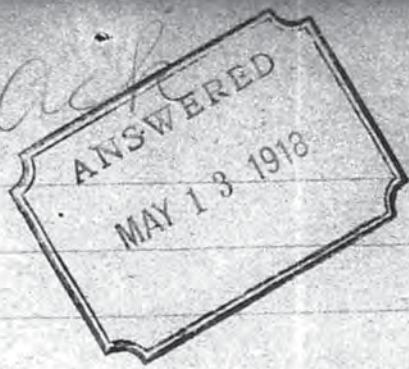
If there are any matters in this connection that require attention as far as you are concerned, I should be glad if you would address your enquiries or wishes to this Department, when they will receive attention.
