NOTE.—(i.) Dear Sir,

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 9th inst. covering letter from Ex. Corporal 1422 D. Collins, with reference to his application for Vocational training under this Committee which was not granted. For your information, I would state the following facts:-

On November 14th, 1919 this man's application for a course in general education was considered, and because of the fact that he was not eligible for a course under the Rules and Regulations governing the Committee, his application was not acceded to. He had applied for a course on the ground of disability, but the report of his medical examiners showed that he was able to resume his former occupation. Mr. Collins was informed of the Committee's decision, and he then requested a re-consideration of his case. It again came before the Committee on November 21st, but as no new facts were forthcoming as to why his application should be granted, the

Committee could only confirm its former decision. On January 23rd, 1920, the case was again considered at the request of the Rev. E. Glench of Spaniard's Bay, but as the Medical authorities still contended that Collins was suffering from no disability that prevented him from carrying on his former employment, the Committee again confirmed its former decisions. On February 20th, the application again came up, this time at the request of Robert Collins father of Duncan, who forwarded a certificate from Dr. Prichard, but as this certificate only stated that Duncan Collins' disability had increased ten per cent owing to the after effects of LaGrippe and there was nothing to show that Collins could not resume his former occupation, the Committee again confirmed its former decisions. Shortly after this, Mr. Robert Collins, father, called on the Vocational Officer and requested him to have his son's case given further consideration and strongly urged that he was unable to carry on. In view of this, it was decided to bring Corp. Collins on to St. Jehn's for further medical examination, and this was done. He was examined ^{and /} radiographed and the medical report was that nothing of a ~~very~~ serious nature could be found which would prevent him from resuming his former work. In view of this, the Committee on March 20th again confirmed its former decisions.

I may say that the disability Collins complains of is rheumatism and he has insisted all through that owing to this complaint he cannot work. However, as you will see from the foregoing, the doctors do not find any evidence of such disability.

With regard to the statement that 2795X Wm. Jones of Upper Island Cove and 1049X J. Hutchings of Spaniard's Bay have received courses although their cases are identical with Collins;

I may say that this is entirely incorrect. Jones was granted a course in Motor Mnfg. on February 20th because of the fact that he was under eighteen years of age when he enlisted and had produced a birth certificate. Hutchings was granted a course in education to fit him for promotion in the Mercantile Marine on August 8th, 1919. He was granted this course because of the fact that he had served four years in the R. N. R. and had applied for a course in Navigation, However, his standard of education was too low to make it possible for him to learn navigation and he was given a course to fit him for promotion in the Merchant's Marine Service.

Collins fitted under none of the Committees regulations and could only claim on the ground of disability; when he failed on this ground, he was entirely without the Regulations. I am returning Mr. Collins' letter herewith, as requested.

to the C.R.C. for a month or so course
in gun education to fit me for a certain

and I was not in good circumstances
enough to pay my own schooling, and be
out of work for a couple of months.
After going through a lot of questions
I rec. a reply saying I was physically
fit to perform my former occupation, a
very poor excuse,
Since then my clergyman has written Dr.
Blackall. I have also rec. several
examinations and all amount to nothing
Sir certainly I must have an enemy on
the C.R.C. In fact I am almost sure
I have, as I consider what I was

asking for was reasonable, I was not seeking a months schooling for the sake of getting the pay from it, neither was I seeking employment, I simply asked for one or two months,

Now Sir are the C.R.E going by the rules laid down for the guidance of the committee if so, I would like you to make an investigation before I go farther, and put it into the hands of the law.

Why is William Jones R.N.R. of Upper Island getting a course, for the Hutchings of Spassway passed through a six months course and several others I wont mention until later on. I dont think they were entitled to a course any more then myself. as I was discharge from the army as medically unfit for further service. Now Sir would you kindly see that my case is more sympathetic considerations

Dear Sir:

I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter under date of the 3rd ult.

With regard to items one and two of your letter. This is a matter that does not come under my jurisdiction. Custom House Officers are appointed by the Executive Government on recommendation of the Minister of Finance and Customs. Poor Commissioners are also appointed by the Executive Government on the recommendation of the Colonial Secretary. As I am not a member of the Executive Government I have no voice in such appointments at the present time.

As to the question of your pension. As you are aware all matters of pensions are now placed in the hands of the Board of Pension Commissioners who have entire jurisdiction and are responsible for the administration of pensions for our soldiers and sailors.

I am therefore sending your letter to this Board requesting the favour of consideration of your case, and to reply to you direct as to what they decide to do.
