



In reply to your letter of the 28/9/17 (6278) regarding the death of your son: I deeply regret to inform you that the report of his death was made by the 12th Divisional Burial Officer, British Expeditionary Force, on 31/8/17. It was to the effect that he was "Killed in action or died of wounds on 14/4/17 or shortly after that date." It may be assumed that his body was found in August and buried behind the line. This report was forwarded to the Hon. Minister of Militia on 22/9/17, and doubtless you have been informed of full particulars by him ere now.

His account will be forwarded to Newfoundland in due course, and application should be made to the Hon. Minister of Militia for any balance that may be due. Any undelivered letters or parcels would be returned to the senders through the Post Office. I am forwarding the identity disc of Cpl. Cook to the Dept. of Militia as customary. It is the only personal effects so far received at this Office.

My Dear Sir:-

I am writing you personally about my poor boy. Can you furnish me with any particulars. We have been hoping against hope, ever since we received the dread news last May, which was the first news we had of him being in action.

April 14th, MISSING, September 24th, Reported KILLED IN ACTION. Was his body recovered, and when? Can you tell me where is the poor fellow buried. Was he found by any of his own regiment, that I can have any news of him. Was there any papers found, on his body, or any message or papers at the Office for "HOME". Has he any money or balance due him, or can you give me any particulars about him being in action.

Do please try and give all details. We are heart broken, my only son. He tried two or three times to enlist before being accepted. Now we are alone to mourn.

Any information from any of his Regiment would be appreciated, the greater number of which knew "Stan Cook", and for all particulars from your Office, I thank you in advance.



In reply to your letter of the 28/9/17 (6278) regarding the death of your son: I deeply regret to inform you that the report of his death was made by the 12th Divisional Burial Officer, British Expeditionary Force, on 31/8/17. It was to the effect that he was "Killed in action or died of wounds on 14/4/17 or shortly after that date." It may be assumed that his body was found in August and buried behind the line. This report was forwarded to the Hon. Minister of Militia on 22/9/17, and doubtless you have been informed of full particulars by him ere now.

His account will be forwarded to Newfoundland in due course, and application should be made to the Hon. Minister of Militia for any balance that may be due. Any undelivered letters or parcels would be returned to the senders through the Post Office. I am forwarding the identity disc of Cpl. Cook to the Dept. of Militia as customary.
