I am writing once again to remind you that though I have been discharged for over three months now I have not yet received a farthing of gratuity money. My finances are still in a very bad state caused principally by three weeks illness (Influenza) contracted the day previous to my discharge, & partly due to my accomodating my expenditure to the promise regarding gratuities read out to us by the Company Officer before signing our discharge papers.
