Dear Mrs Cornick,

Your letter of 22nd March, concerning #377, Cpl. E. Cornick, addressed to the Prime Minister has been passed to the department and I am directed to reply. It is presumed that you received the telegram sent by this department on the 19th Nov., stating that furlough for this soldier had been taken up with the Officer Commanding 1st Batt., who stated that it was impossible to grant furlough to Newfoundland. The decision of course would be made in view of regulations existing in France issued by the Commander in Chief. With reference to furlough for the first five hundred I would state that Sir Walter Davidson took the opportunity of representing this matter to the War Office by cable before he left this Country and again brought the matter up in person when he reached London some few months ago. The matter of furlough for all members of the original Contingents of all Overseas Forces was being considered by the War Office at that time and their reply was that although they were quite in sympathy with the request they regretted that it was not feasible. They state further that no exception could be made to the advantage of one Dominion and give them privilege which could not be enjoyed by all. This department too would like very much to be able to get all the members of the original five hundred who are now serving returned to this Country for a period of leave.

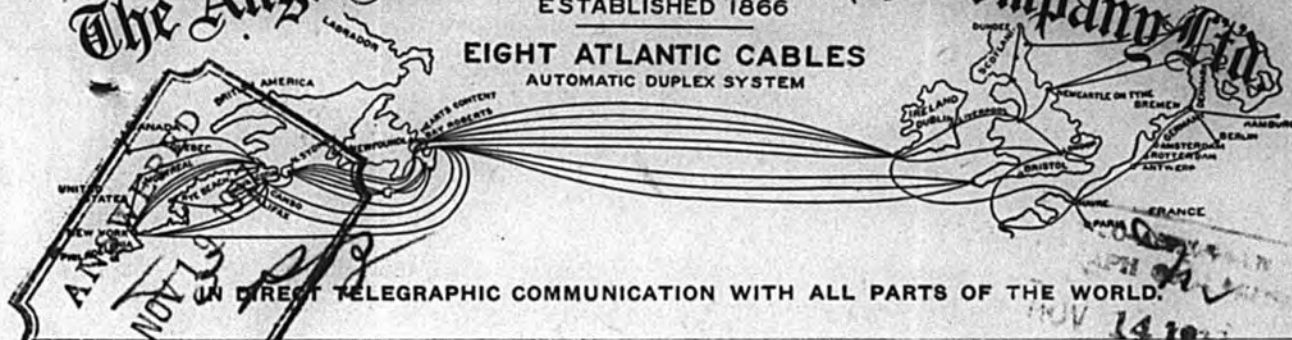
