Descriptive Return of a Soldier Discharged on Account of Disability.

INSTRUCTIONS—This form is to be completed in the case of every discharged soldier whose claim to pension, on account of disability, is to be submitted for the consideration of the Pensions and Disabilities Board.



I have the honour to submit claim for difference in rate of pay between that paid in the R. A. M. C., and that in force in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment during the period 27/10/15 to 25/8/16, whilst I was serving with the former Corps, which I would thank you to forward to the Minister of Militia (Newfoundland) for consideration.

Before enlisting in the R. A. M. C., which was done through cable by the St. John's Ambulance Brigade Ex Nos. 2145, Corp. M. Stick, 2146, Pte. J. Woods (who were Prisoners of War for a considerable time) 2149, L/C., F. A. Janes, E. Churchill and myself were promised that augmentation pay would be granted us so that we would receive the same rate as a private in the Regiment. ~~It was further promised that the same rate would be granted us if we were discharged from the R. A. M. C. before the end of the war.~~

I, with the others, embarked from Newfoundland 27/10/15, and with the exception of Churchill (who failed to pass the Medical examination in London and subsequently returned to Newfoundland) were taken on the strength of the R. A. M. C. from 10/11/15. During the period between embarkation and 10/11/15 we drew no pay whatever. From the latter date to 18/8/16 (date of discharge from the R. A. M. C.) we drew pay at the rate of 1/6 per day. As the pay of a private in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment is 4/7 the difference i. e., 3/1 per day for the period in question would be only about what we actually were out of pocket and I think should be paid us, as during the time we were with the Imperial Forces we constantly had to get remittances from home to keep us in necessaries, the 1/6 per day not going very far.

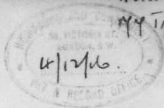

Sir,-

I have the honour to submit claim for difference in rate of pay between that paid in the R. A. M. C., and that in force in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment during the period 27/10/15 to 25/8/16, whilst I was serving with the former Corps, which I would thank you to forward to the Minister of Militia (Newfoundland) for consideration.

Before enlisting in the R. A. M. C., which was done through cable by the St. John's Ambulance Brigade Ex Nos. 2145 Corp. M. Stick, 2146, Pte J. Woods (who were Prisoners of War for a considerable time) 2149 I/C. F. A. Janes, B. Churchill and myself were promised that augmentation pay would be granted us so that we would receive the same rate as a private in the Regiment.

I, with the others, embarked from Newfoundland 27/10/15, and with the exception of Churchill (who failed to pass the Medical examination in London and subsequently returned to Newfoundland) were taken on the strength of the R. A. M. C. from 10/11/15. During the period between embarkation and 10/11/15 we drew no pay whatever. From the latter date to 18/8/16 (date of ~~discharge~~ discharge from the R. A. M. C.) we drew pay at the rate of 1/6 per day. As the pay of a private in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment is 4/7d the difference i. e., 3/1d per day for the period in question would be only what we actually were out of pocket and I think should be paid us, as during the time we were with the Imperial Forces we constantly had to get remittances from home to keep us in necessaries, the 1/6d per day not going very far.


