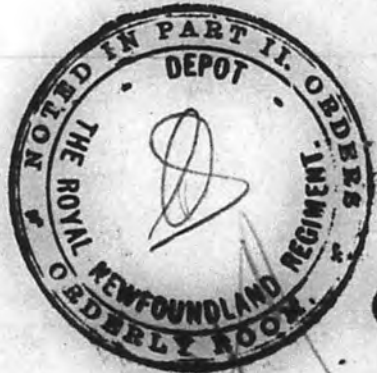

A half barrel of cement costs \$2.25 here, and \$2 or \$ 3 should purchase enough lumber for the frame, which, I presume can be had in Cape Broyle. I can arrange to send a man from here if no one is available for the work in Cape Broyle, but would prefer a man from that place.

The attached might be of use to the Contractor, and will give the measurements of the curb.
