Dear Sirs:-

About four or five months' ago I wrote you regarding Separation Allowance, for my late Son, Corporal W.P. Costello, 1142, D. 1st. N.F.L.D. Regtmt.

In reply to same you sent me a questionnaire to fill in. I answered questions and had it signed by the different parties, as requested on sheet, and when I sent it to the Red Cross People to have it signed, they claimed that they had to forward it to it's proper destination, so I left it in their hands. About a week after that the Red Cross People called on me with another list of questions to answer, but to all of these questions I have not had any reply as yet.

It seems very hard to hear and know of so much money being allowed for Military purposes, and considering my Son is now over three years' killed, to think that I have not been able to get any recompense whatever, and moreover when it would be of such benefit to a person in my state of health, not to mention the loss of such a Son, who can never be replaced.

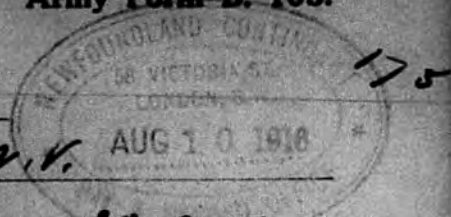



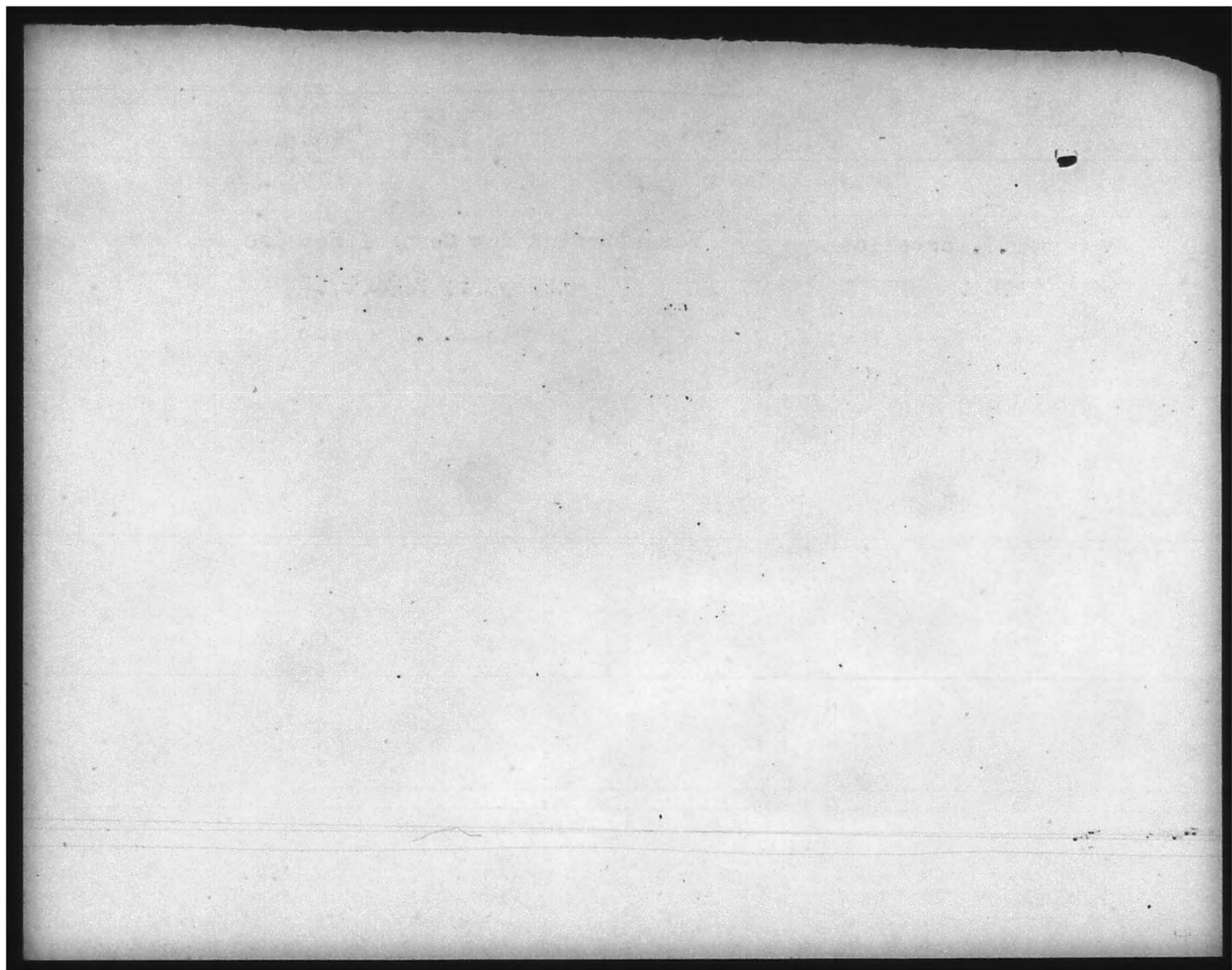
