

In reply to your letter of 1/2/18 (2294) regarding letters and parcels for the above named N.C.O.: I have to inform that a parcel was received at this Office for L/C. Courage and forwarded to France 7/1/18, another was forwarded to the same destination 19/1/18. It is assumed that these were the parcels you speak of, and doubtless L/C. Courage has written to tell you he has received them. You will, of course, understand that mails take a long time to reach France from Newfoundland, and although soldiers very often write home to say that they have not received such and such parcels, more often than not the self-same parcel reaches them soon after they have written.

No record of letters is kept at this Office, except registered ones, but all for L/C. Courage would be forwarded without delay, and it hoped that you have since heard that he has received them.

Any enquiries for postal matter should be made at the Post Office in your locality, as this makes it easier to trace missing letters or parcels.


