Dear Mr. Squires:

I have the honour to state for your information the case of Mrs. Margaret Coxworthy of Freshwater Road, who is claiming Separation Allowance on account of her son No. 1304 Ex.Pte. Pierre Coxworthy. Mrs. Coxworthy's other son No.1820 Ex.Pte. Frank Coxworthy also served. Pierre made an allotment in favour of his mother of 60¢ per day and Frank made an allotment of 70¢ per day. This case has been before the Board of Review several times for consideration and the Board have been unable to pass the claim for payment because it has not been proved to their satisfaction that the two boys are her sole support. Attached to the claim is an order of the Court at Grand Bank signed by Mr.George Foresy, J.P., and Mr. George Buffett, J.P. in which it is shown that with the consent of Mr. and Mrs. Coxworthy the court ordered that Mrs. Coxworthy should be allowed the custody of her youngest child and that Mr. Coxworthy should pay her forthwith a sum of twenty dollars (\$20.00) and should pay as alimony for her and her child to the Magistrate at Grand Bank, the sum of sixteen dollars(\$16.00) per month. The first monthly payment was due and payable on the day that Mrs. Coxworthy left Grand Bank and on corresponding dates each month thereafter for as long as this order remains in force. The order is dated the 20th of July 1912.

This Department referred this case to the Department of Justice with a view to obtaining further information about the



payment or non-payment of alimony for Mrs. Coxworthy. The Justice Department obtained a report from Magistrate McDonald of Grand Bank in which it is stated that Mr. Coxworthy has not contributed to the support of his wife since sometime in 1913. The report quotes the sworn statement by Mr. Coxworthy that he paid alimony in accordance with the order of the court for 13 months and that he then found that he was unable to pay. He states that he has not had any money transferred in any way to avoid paying the amount stipulated and he offers her to come and live in the house with him and he will support <sup>her</sup> as well as he can. Magistrate McDonald is of opinion that Mr. Coxworthy can afford, under his present circumstances, to support his wife, or at least give her the amount ordered by the court. The Department of Justice stated that "it is the duty of Mrs. Coxworthy to compel her husband to live up to this agreement. The Justice of the Peace who made the order, only, did so on her motion and it is not their business to follow the wife up."

Under the foregoing conditions the Board of Review are unable to grant this allowance which is payable only when the soldier on whose account it is claimed is proved to be the sole support.
