Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of yours of the 5th ultimo,, in connection with the claim of Mrs. Margaret Coxworthy to be granted a separation allowance.

You ask me to ascertain if her contention that her husband is not contributing to her support is correct and if so, why the Court does not require him to make such provision.

I have had Magistrate MacDonald make an enquiry into this matter and I now enclose you his report. By reference to it you will notice that Frederick Coxworthy has not contributed to the support of his wife since some time in 1913. Magistrate MacDonald is of the opinion that Mr. Coxworthy can afford under his present circumstances to support his wife, or at least give her the \$16.00 per month ordered by the Court.

As to why the Court does not require Coxworthy to make provision for his wife, I beg to refer you to the papers sent me on March 5th, amongst which is an order by Messrs. Forsey & Buffett on the defendant Coxworthy to pay his wife

1913.

Upon the Complaint of Maggie Coxworthy wife of Frederick J Coxworthy of Grand Bank, Dealer in Marine Stores the said Frederick J Coxworthy stands charged for that he has refused and refuses to pay her the monthly sum of \$16⁰⁰ per month payable to her for her support as ordered by the Court at a hearing in Grand Bank on the 20th day of June, 1912.

The said Frederick J Coxworthy pleads inability to pay the amount asked for.

The plaintiff was not present, and a deposition made by her before one the said Magistrate was exhibited showing that she had been living at St. John's with one Child since July 1912, that the defendant had paid her \$16⁰⁰ per month from that time for twelve months, and since that time she had received nothing from him, and that she claims eighty for alimony to Dec and fifteen dollars for expenses from and to St. John's

I declare I Conscientiously Defendant Sworn Faith; I am the husband of the Plaintiff. An order was made by the Court in June 1912 to the effect that my wife should be allowed to live in St. John's with her youngest child and that I should pay her fifteen dollars per month for maintenance. I paid the money for twelve months and then found that I was unable to pay. I have not paid her anything since July last. When the order was made I gave my income at that time as about three or four hundred dollars a year. During the past year I have done very little. I have lost more than 200 dollars in my business. I have no money now.

The little I had in reserve last year I have been working on. I dropped 204 dollars on a lot of fur that I bought and sold, and also lost money

money on a shipment of junk and rubber.

I have no money in the Bank, I have not had any money transferred in any way to avoid paying the amount stipulated in the order of the Court. I have no proposition to make to pay her to live in St. Johns, I am not in a position to do so. I offer her to come and live in the house with me and I will support her as well as I can, and share what I have with her. She has always wanted to live in St. Johns, and wants me to support her there.

In my circumstances at present I am unable to do so, and unable to offer any monthly sum to her because I have not the money to pay.

If she and the boy were here I may be able to do better, as I could go away from here, and the boys could look after my business while I would be away, as I am now I cannot leave the shop, I should have to shut it up and lose more on this end than I would gain on the other. The only offer I can make is for her come and live with me and share what I have and what I can earn.

Perceval L. Carr sworn with. I am manager of the Bank of Nova Scotia at Grand Bank.

Mr. Coxworthy the defendant has no account with the bank, and is not in credit with the bank.

bank. He has never had an account with the bank. It is not true that he has had any money transferred from his account at any time by the bank.

There is no further entry of the case other than the foregoing - Amason

It is true that her husband has not contributed to her support since the date specified in the foregoing report of the cases. I think Mr Corwin could afford under his present circumstances to support his wife or at least give her the \$16^{per month} ordered by the Court.

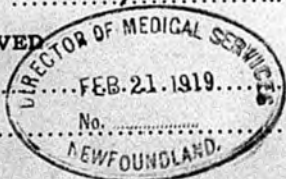
