With reference to this office Nos.13219/173/P&A, 5/12/17 and 1731/77/P&A, 2/2/18, the following letter from S.S.M. B. Crocker is quoted, 22/2/19 (1661):

"In December, 1917, I made application for Separation Allowance for my widowed mother, but although I had contributed to her support previous to my enlistment in May, 1915 and still continue to do so, the Allowance could not be granted as I had not made an allotment of my pay in her favour.
"In view of the fact that Separation Allowance has now been granted to dependents from 1914, I beg to claim the Separation Allowance for the period in which I paid an allotment of 60 cents per day.
"An Allotment on Forms N.F.P/11 No. 96 beginning 18/3/16 for 60 cents per day was made in favor of Miss B. Crocker, c/o Bank of Montreal, St. John's, Newfoundland. This allotment was paid up to 31/5/17 but was suspended for the months of August and September, 1916, which gives the following.

Claim is under consideration, please.

"In December, 1917, I made application for Separation Allowance for my widowed mother, but although I had contributed to her support previous to my enlistment in May, 1915 and still continue to do so, the Allowance could not be granted as I had not made an allotment of my pay in her favour.
"In view of the fact that Separation Allowance has now been granted to dependents from 1914, I beg to claim the Separation Allowance for the period in which I paid an allotment of 60 cents per day.
"An Allotment on Forms N.F.P/11 No. 96 beginning 18/3/16 for 60 cents per day was made in favor of Miss B. Crocker, c/o Bank of Montreal, St. John's, Newfoundland. This allotment was paid up to 31/5/17 but was suspended for the months of August and September, 1916, which gives the following.

My dear Boyd.

I'm sorry I have delayed answering your last letter, but I have been wracking my brains to find some way to help you out in your efforts to get that money for mother. It is true that I was pronounced as unfit for service in the U.S. Army but not by a regular army doctor. I was working in New York when they first called for men to go across as engineers, and P. Mc Govern my employer was asked to furnish some of the men, some 10 of us offered to go and we were examined by the Companies doctor, he knew about the trouble I had with my knee, and told me at once that I would be of no use over across, and that I could not possibly pass the examination, so I never bothered any more about it, except to register for the draft. I was exempt from the first on account of my age, and ~~he~~ was placed in class 2, in the 2nd. I was never called. I am enclosing my registration card

that might be of service to you but I hardly think it will. So far as I know, in fact I am sure, that no records were kept by Mr. Bowen, he had his doctor examine the men because he wanted to keep all of them that he could on his job. so I never put much stock in what his old doctor did. I am however sure, that if I had been examined for the regular army, that I could never have gotten by, for the bursa or the cushion to my right knee cap has been taken out, and my knee has been so tender, ever since the operation that up until about three months ago, I couldn't kneel on it, it is getting better all the time tho' and I hardly notice it at all now. If you think it would be of any use, I could get a copy of the record, of my stay, operation &c at the Charlestown Hospital, It was three or four years ago since I was there, and as the U.S. wasn't at war at that time I don't think it would be of any use; however I think I could get it if necessary.

The baby is growing like sixty, weighs eleven pounds now, Josephine is fine. Nance, and Fred and his family are all well. Jo is calling me to go to bed, so must go. Tender regard to both from Jo & self. You being brother will
