On or about the 20th. of December 1917, I left London (being invalided to Newfoundland), in company with another soldier, Pte. L. Pilgrim. 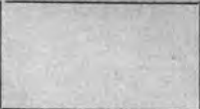



Dear Sir:-

In reply to your letter of June the 8th, referring to the matter of Separation Allowance payable on your account while holding the appointment of Superintending Clerk, I may say that your case has been fully considered, and it is regretted that the increased Separation Allowance is not applicable in your case.

Your case is a parallel one to a man who may be a private, but who holds the appointment of an Orderly Room clerk, and receives pay equivalent to an Orderly Room Sergt. In that case, such a man would be paid Separation Allowance issuable to the dependent of a private, and not that payable to the dependent of a sergt. Perhaps a clearer explanation would be that Superintending Clerk is an appointment and not a rank.

I trust this explanation is clear, otherwise, I should be glad to go further into the matter with you.

Dear Mr. Squires:-

With reference to the letter of July 7th addressed to you by No. 2965 S.Q.M.S. R.J. Crummy. I would state that this man's promotions are as follows:-

Appointed L/Cerpl. 20th May, 1916  
 Promoted Staff Sergt. 1st July, 1918  
 Promoted S.Q.M.S. 1st Feb., 1919  
 and graded as Superintending Clerk on 1st Dec., 1919

His grading as Superintending Clerk went through Daily Orders early in Jan. 1920, and was antedated.

In his letter he states that he was originally senior H.C.O. in the Pay Office, but since has been third in seniority. I do not follow his argument of being third on the list, as the only men in the Pay Office senior to him are S.S.M. Willey of the London Office staff and S.S.M. Ivany of the local Pay Office staff; and the London Office staff must be treated as a separate unit. S.S.M. Willey was appointed S.Q.M.S. on 21st Dec., 1918 in London, and S.Q.M.S. Crummy was appointed to that rank on 1st February, 1919. That eliminates Willey. I am led to believe that most of Crummy's dissatisfaction is in the case of S.S.M. Ivany; but I would explain that Ivany was appointed and entered the Pay Office with the rank of C.Q.M.S. which was dated from 12th August, 1918, at that time Crummy was S.S. and, therefore, junior. Ivany's grading from C.Q.M.S. to S.Q.M.S. dates from 10th Feb., 1919, or nine days after Crummy's promotion; but it must be remembered that S.Q.M.S. implies a staff appointment and carries with it a higher rate of pay than the regimental rank of C.Q.M.S., and there was no apparent reason why Ivany should lose his seniority.

Crummy refers to his opinion that he should be granted a commission. I am afraid that I do not agree with his point of view in that respect. He has done efficient work since he has been in the Pay Office, and in my opinion his case has been fairly and justly handled. I would take an opportunity of discussing with the Paymaster the advisability of promoting him to the rank of S.S.M., but cannot recommend consideration of his case for appointment to a commission.

I think he has been a little unfair in stating that Major Howley had not given him just consideration because of his political endeavours; my experience in Major Howley's recommendations for promotions has always been that they are made after proper consideration and conservatively, and bearing in mind the responsibility and work to be performed by the individual concerned, and the way in which these duties have been carried out.

Opinion of the Medical Board.

NOTES.—(i.)
