That owing to Gurnew being unmarried and his parents and only brother dead, his home and place is rapidly going to decay. The fences being down and his farm becoming a common, and in consequence they urge in consideration of Gurnew's efforts and sacrifices, and in consideration of his being at the present moment invalided, it would be only reasonable that he be
