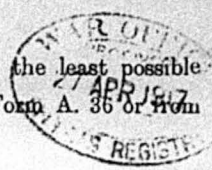

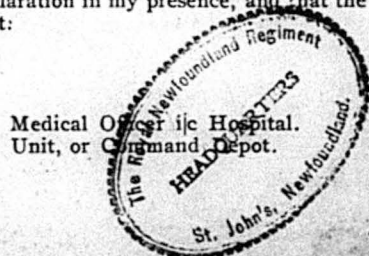

My object in writing this letter is that I may secure a separation allowance for my mother. When I enlisted in the Royal Inf. Regt. in March 1915 there was no separation in force. And as I was taken a prisoner by the Germans on the 14th of April 1917 had remained in enemy hands until after the signing of the Armistice, and I arrived home by the last "Coriscan". Owing to my 70 months captivity I did not know of any separation allowance being paid to dependents of soldiers of the Inf. Regt. nor did my mother know anything of the matter.

My Mother and Brother were solely dependent on ~~my~~ me during my four years in the Army. Consequently I feel that they are entitled to a separation allowance dating from its inception. If an application ^{form} should
