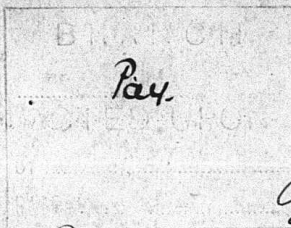

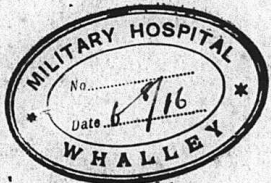

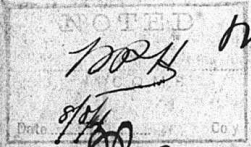

Well Mother this is third time wounded & I tell you I am just about sick of it but I expect I have to spend another Winter out here it is quite awhile since I had a letter from you & I have not got any parcels yet.

I dont think there is much good in giving you my address where I am now for I expect by the time you get this I will be out again, give my best regards to all the friends & Mrs. Snow & family so I think this is all for this time, so good bye with love father and yourself, I am your soldier lad.

I expect by the time you get this I will be with the regiment again thats if I get betterbut I am feeling fine now I dont think there is much more I have to say this time if you are sending me a parcel you can send me a pair of mitts for the winter give my best respects to father & all the friends around & especially Mrs.Snow & family so this is all for this time hoping to hear from soon ,so goodbye for this time .
