STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR

No. 4216            Private            Thomas Day  
Address:        Clarke's Head, Gander Bay.

Enlisted:    Nov. 15th, 1917.    Proceeded overseas:    March, 1918.

Company in France:    "D"    .    Date and place of capture:    Near Ypres, Oct. 14/18

CIRCUMSTANCES OF CAPTURE:        I was a Company Runner and we went over the top about 6 a.m. behind a smoke barrage. During the morning the Headquarters got separated from the rest of the Company. There were about ten of us and we found ourselves close up to one of the German big guns. There was a large number of Germans, nearly 300 I should say, who opened up fire on us with rifles. We started to go back and get into the smoke again, as they were too many for us, and join the remainder of the Company, who were somewhere on our right, about 11 am. I was detailed to get into touch with the nearest company. About ten minutes after I left I saw three Germans, who covered me with their rifles. I had a bomb in my pocket and took it out and withdrew the pin. I had my hand raised over my head just ready to throw it, when my arm was seized from behind and I found myself in the hands of about 27 Germans. The ground at the time was clouded with smoke and I hardly could see more than about 15 yards from me, and these Germans were hiding in the smoke. They tied my hand around the bomb to keep the spring in, so as not to explode the bomb, and then wrenched my fingers off the bomb one by one and pulled out the bomb and threw it into a shell hole.

LIFE AND TREATMENT WHILST A PRISONER:        Two of the Germans then led me away to their own lines. They brought me up near the big gun where I saw the large crowd of Germans collected. They asked me a lot of questions about the Regiment, but I told them nothing, as I would not understand their bad English. They then took me back with a number of English prisoners and we had to march until 8 o'clock that night, when we arrived at a small village where we were put into a cellar. At midnight we were ordered to march on to another village, at which we arrived about 1 p.m. the next day. Here we stayed three days and I was interviewed by a Sergeant-Major in good English, who asked me all sorts of questions about our troops. I was questioned by him



from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. We entrained from here and came to a town about two hours away, where there were 2500 prisoners, I was the only Newfoundlander in the bunch. I was here for about a fortnight, and we were set to work at different things, farming, digging and unloading barbed wire from the river-boats. We were given very bad food and very little at that and we almost starved. I lived on watery soup, potato peels and turnip peels and coffee most of the time. I think there was very little food there for the Germans themselves. I saw them kill old worn out horses and cut them up and put them in the big boiler that they boiled our soup in. They were very strict in the camp and used to punish us for the least thing. I often saw the German sentries using their bayonets on the prisoners and prodding them. The camp was then broken up and we were sent in different directions. Fifteen of us went to a village, after having marched for four days and we stayed here till the armistice was signed. We heard about the Armistice the first day and knew it when we saw the Belgian flags flying in the village. We were allowed out to go and do as we liked, and two days afterwards were sent back on the way to England. We were marched for two days till we reached the frontier between Belgium and Holland, and when we were about two miles from the frontier fence the Germans let us go, and we were on our own. There were about 700 of us altogether. The Dutch sentries would not let us pass and we had to wait around there for about 12 days, the Belgians giving us food and shelter. Then we got orders that we could get through the gate and we crossed over into Holland where some English Officers took charge of us. We were sent to Rotterdam and then back to England. I got no letters or parcels whilst I was under the Germans.

REMARKS: This man is illiterate and cannot remember the names of towns, villages, camps etc.
