Sir:-

Your communication of 10th instant in connection with this man has been received. Had he remained at home and waited till his application for exemption was heard, no difficulty would have arisen. As it is he came forward to St. John's, voluntarily enlisted, was sworn into the service, and has received clothing issue and pay.

You will understand that when a man is sworn into the service, it is very difficult to arrange for his discharge. There is nothing to be done at the present time, but when this man reports for service, the matter will be given every consideration. In any event he can make an allotment of at least 50% per day towards the support of his mother, and if she is solely or mainly dependent upon him, she can claim Separation Allowance of \$20.00 per month.

I am sorry to have to write about the following matter. Henry Dean of St Anthony returned from St Johns yesterday, having been there to join the Army. He passed & was accepted; but in his Examination did not state that he was practically the sole support of his mother (Mrs Matthew Dean). She is 61 years old & he lives with her; He alone, as all her sons & daughters are married. His mother is depending on this young man for support. She finds it very hard to think that he must go away. She is very sick at present. Her husband is dead. Henry should have stated these facts but didn't. His mother received his Exemption papers just after he had gone away to St Johns.

Although he has been accepted, is it strictly compulsory or necessary for Henry to go? I have stated facts as they are, and I know you will give them your kindest consideration. Could you please wire me result of decision, as it takes several days for mail to arrive here. Henry Deans number is 615, he is forwarding a letter also.

Believing that you will kindly consider this claim, hoping that it may be possible for Henry to remain home, I remain,
